Unfortunately, Drake would suffer an injury late in the first quarter and wouldn't return. As of press time Monday, his injury is believed to be a torn meniscus and his status for the reminder of the season is uncertain.

As for the Panthers, they would allow Lumpkin to narrow the gap to 21-17 until Crawford Colwell attacked the basket and scored inside at the horn - giving his team a 23-17 lead after one.

Union County opened the second with an 11-0 run that included 5 points from RJ Banton and two each from Crawford Colwell, Pierson Allison, and Cole Davis to open up a 34-17

Crawford Colwell halted a 4-0 spurt by the Indians with a stick-back at the 3:22 mark, then a Britt Waller basket made it 38-23 with 1:52 before the

After Lumpkin sliced the margin to 38-27 in the final minute, Union coach Casey Jones, displeased with his team's effort, yanked the starters for five reserves resulting in sophomore Kyle Morlock knocking down a base line jumper to give the Panthers a 40-27 lead at the

Union didn't take long to blow the lid off the game in the second half, extending the margin to 21 at the midway point of the third and leading by as many as 29 at the 90-second mark of the period.

A corner-trey from Baggett got things rolling then Candler Colwell got in on the act with a 3-ball of his own. Five Lumpkin points sandwiched around an Allison bucket would be the last of its offense before the Panthers went for the jugular with another 11-0 run.

It began with a 1-for-2 trip to the line for Candler Colwell, making it 49-32. Moments he later, he turned a steal into a layup on the other end. Baggett


Rebels are currently 0-6 in re-
