Panthers reach 15 wins; enter Region 8-AA Tournament as No. 4 seed

Entering the final week of the season, Union County (15-9, 8-6) was locked into the No. 4 seed in the upcoming Region 8-AA Tournament. But that didn't mean the Panthers weren't playing for pride when they visited Banks County on Wednesday and hosted Oglethorpe County for Senior Night on Friday

In the first meeting with Banks, Union County jumped out to a 14-0 lead only to go scoreless down the stretch while the Leopards closed on a 13-0 run to escape Blairsville with the win.

The second time around, the Panthers fell victim to 13-3 run after leading 60-58 with under two minutes to play. This time around, however, it was Banks County that jumped out to a huge early lead, only to watch the visitors storm back and take control. Unfortunately, the Panthers weren't able to ride that momentum to a victory as Banks County held on for a 71-63 victory.

After narrowly escaping the earlier meeting at Oglethorpe County, Union didn't give the Patriots the chance to hang around on Friday as they outscored Oglethorpe 21-9 in the second quarter before putting the visitors away with a 12-0 run in the early stages of the third.

"I thought we played well from the middle of the second quarter on," Union County coach Casey Jones said. "That was pretty much the case at Banks County too. We've got to do a better job of putting four quarters together when we get into the playoffs."

Panthers 71, Oglethorpe County 43 -- Union County torched the Patriots 42-16 in the second and third quarters as Oglethorpe County never threatened the Panthers on Senior Night.

Senior Christian Robertson and junior Pierson Allison each scored a game-high 17 points to lead Union County to 15 wins for the sixth time in seven years and the fifth time in six seasons under Jones.

"We made it to 15 wins, which is something that we shoot for," Jones said. "(15 wins) is not a great year but it's a pretty good year."

Getting the start on Senior Night, Robertson joined fellow senior starter Britt Waller in the post and the duo combined for 17 first-half points with Robertson's 11 leading all scorers.

"I go up against Christian in practice so I know from experience how hard he is to stop,' Waller said after the game. "He's a big dude and once he gets his momentum going towards the goal, he's almost impossible to

the head cut his night short and sent him to the trainer's table in the third quarter with 6 points.

Seniors Coleson Daniel and Kanon Hemphill also turned in a pair of 6-point performances with Daniel scoring 4 points in the fourth and Hemphill getting all six in the first three quarters.

"I appreciate everything these seniors have done, whether I've had them four years or one vear," Jones said. "They're good boys and they've always been
