Senior Evelyn McBride accepts Air Force Academy appointment

It's no small feat for a high school student to get an appointment to the United States Air Force Academy, let alone an early admission appointment. But that's exactly what Union County High School senior Evelyn McBride

On Tuesday, Feb. 18, McBride officially accepted her appointment from retired Air Force Lt. Col. Johnny Deloach in front of over 100 people, including family members, classmates, teachers and administrators inside the Multipurpose Room of the high

"Without further ado, I want to present to Evelyn

to the United States Air Force Academy, Class of 2024,' Deloach said, as he handed and get military training, so it's McBride an appointment the best of both worlds, really. certificate and saluted her.

McBride will report to the academy on June 25 to begin six weeks of basic training, where she will pledge a lifetime oath to support and defend the Constitution of the United States.

The patriotic senior is only the second UCHS student ever to get an appointment to the Air Force Academy, following Tsali D. Bentley II, who graduated from the Academy in May 2017 having earned a bachelor's degree in Systems Engineering with a focus in Aeronautical Engineering.

"I always knew I wanted

McBride said. "Going to the Academy allows me to do that

"And just wanting to go to the Academy in general, I wanted to push myself to be the best I can be, and I knew that the Academy would be the best way to do that," she said, adding that she definitely has plans to become an Air Force

She was nominated for her appointment by Congressman Doug Collins, after which the Academy looked at her and wasted no time in saying yes. Bill Kokaly from Rep. Collins' office awarded McBride a Certificate of Congressional Recognition in the ceremony See McBride, Page 3A

Libraries hire Heath Lee of Gilmer County as new system director By Shawn Jarrard Director Lee will begin his new job helming up the

BLUE RIDGE - The 12-member Mountain Regional Library System Board of Trustees hired Heath Lee to serve as the system's new library director in a regional board meeting held on Wednesday, Feb. 19, in the Fannin County Courthouse.

Lee was recommended by a specially assigned committee tasked with finding a replacement for former library director Vince Stone, and the committee picked Lee out of five applicants.

In the Feb. 19 meeting, Lee spoke with the Board of Trustees for several minutes before the board went into executive session to discuss the matter, after which they voted to hire him as director and welcomed him to the system.

transitioning from his position as manager of the Sequoyah Regional Library in Gilmer County, where he has been since 2014. Regional board members had been hunting a new director since separating with former director Stone last October, citing at the time efforts "to


