Highway 180 going to Suches. How did you get a photo from there with snow on the highway?

A. It was not easy. We started about a year ago trying to get permission to place a camera in this location. We thought we had the basic infrastructure at Wolf Pen Gap to place a camera there because the school in Suches has fiber and Wi-Fi, which run beside Hwy 180. There is also a power pole close to the fiber cable, which made camera installation practical. It has taken a good part of the year to get data and permission from the USFS to place it at this point which is on their property. This is not a complaint, but it just takes time when working with the federal government, especially when you are asking permission to go where you have never gone

Q. Why choose Wolf Pen Gap for a weather camera?

A. We know from experience that if anyone needed to get across Wolf Pen Gap by vehicle from Suches in snowy or icing conditions, this is the highest point between Blairsville and Suches. It is also usually the coldest. If an ambulance or an emergency service vehicle (Fire Department, Road Department, GDOT or Sheriff) needs to get to Suches in bad weather, we have needed a view from this point for a long time, since it is usually the worst weather spot on Highway 180. If this area of the road is clear or looks passable. it should be clear on the rest of the road to Suches or to Blairsville. GDOT does a great job on this State Highway, but it is difficult to get a report from a GDOT truck on the condition of the road. Hopefully, by next winter we will have some weather equipment there in addition to the camera and we are excited about the possibilities.

Q. Will the people in Suches be able to view the new Wolf Pen Gap camera?

A. We are still working on that, since this location is so remote. We hope to have this in good working order before next winter. Currently, we can view the camera in a stop action mode at the office, but we hope to have full video later on. Then it will be like the camera on Neels Gap and we will see if we can figure out how to make the cameras viewable by the public.

I want to thank the United States Forest Service, the Georgia Department of Transportation, Blue Ridge Mountain EMC and our computer techs, Jeff and Kristian Burks for working so hard on this

dopamine is the one that reinforces cravings for pleasurable behaviors, like eating a piece of chocolate cake or playing a video game. With repeated use, stimulants like methamphetamine can disrupt how the brain's dopamine system works, reducing a person's ability to feel pleasure from normal, everyday activities. People will often develop tolerance, which means they must take more of the drug to get the desired effect. If a person becomes addicted, they might take the drug

just to feel "normal." After the "high" of methamphetamine wears off, many people experience a "crash" and feel tired or sad for days. They also experience a strong craving to take methamphetamine again to try to feel better. This continued crave and use cycle leads to a psychological dependence on the drug.

Some plants are able to tolerate cold weather while others can't. Scientist believe the ability to tolerate cold weather comes down to the makeup of the cell membranes in the plant. Cell membranes are made up of fat molecules. Some of them are saturated and some unsaturated. Similar to what you read on the nutrition facts label for packaged food. Scientists think that plants with a higher ratio of saturated fats can freeze more easily.
