Soccer: Shorthanded Panthers edge Leopards, struggle at No. 1 Putnam

Without the services of the injured Kobi Robbins, Union County survived Banks County's upset-bid thanks to a late goal from senior David Van Pelt.

Later in the week, the Panthers suffered their most lopsided Region 8-AA defeat in more than a decade, a 5-1 loss at top-ranked Putnam County.

Now, with the season on hold, Union County (6-2 overall, 3-1 in region play) currently sits in second place in 8-AA but are tied in the loss column with three teams.

One of those teams, Rabun County, the Panthers already own a victory over. As for the other two opponents, last Friday's visit to Elbert County was postponed, and a March 27 contest with Social Circle will likely suffer the same fate.

Baseball: Panthers drop three-straight, fall to sixth place in Region 8-AA

Union County endured its toughest stretch of the season, suffering three straight losses in what could be the final week of the season.

Following a pair of losses to Social Circle on Monday and another to Gilmer on Wednesday, the Panthers currently sit at 4-8 overall and 1-3 in region play, placing them sixth in Region 8-AA. Union County was unable to halt its recent skid when last Friday's doubleheader at Monticello suffered a postponement. Sitting one game back of fourth, the Panthers would not qualify for a State playoff spot, should the Coronavirus outbreak force a cancelation of the regular season.

Panthers 2, Social Circle 8 - In a region doubleheader rescheduled from the previous Friday, Union County was unable to overcome an 8-0 third-inning deficit in a game one loss on Monday, March 9.


Seniors John Mancuso and Cayden Rich finished with two hits apiece, accounting for four of the team's six hits.

Four pitchers saw work for the Panthers with freshman Tyler Loyd going a team-high 3.2 innings. Loyd entered in the second with his team trailing 6-0 and was able to escape a basesloaded jam.

Later, Hunter Loyd reached on an error allowing Swartz to bring home Mancuso and Wright with a base hit to left.

After Swartz pitched around a one-out error in the sixth, the Panthers cut it to 8-5 when Kelly reached on a fielder's choice and eventually scored on a Mullinack groundout.

Two walks and a sacrifice bunt set the stage for Social Circle to put the game away with a tworun single in the seventh.

Panthers 2, Gilmer 3 -After routing Gilmer 10-0 last month, the Union bats struggled in a 3-2 loss to the Bobcats on Wednesday, March 11.

Trailing 3-1, the Panthers got one back in the sixth but fell short as Gilmer retired six-straight Union hitters to end the game.
