Q. What does this membership cover?

A. When you sign up for the membership with Air Methods/Airlife GA 14, you are signing up for a membership and not a service. This membership covers a medically necessary helicopter transfer to another hospital.

Q. Since Union County government and Union General Hospital paid the membership fee for almost 5000 people and families last year, will we have to pay the fee this year?

A. No. Union County Government and Union General Hospital have agreed to provide this service free to the public for one more year. There will be no cost for you

to sign up, but you MUST sign up to be eligible. We know of a few helicopter flights and patients that were charged and all they had to do is sign up for this FREE service. There will be no cost to you to sign up.

Q. How and where do we sign up for the Emergency Medical Helicopter Membership?

A. If you were a member last year, you can simply fill out the form when you receive it in the mail. For those who have never signed up before, the company will be providing details in the near future and when they are available, we will let you know in this space here and it will be publicized in the *North Georgia News* and on Facebook as well.

table to addiction. Talking to teens about these risks can curb underage drinking.

Regular marijuana users most often started during their adolescence. Most high school seniors today do not think occasionally smoking marijuana carries any risk. More than 20 percent of teens report having used marijuana at least once in the past month.

Many prescription drugs have intoxicating effects, and this is no secret to most teens. Narcotic painkillers like OxyContin, and benzodiazepines like Xanax, produce pleasurable effects that teens may seek out. These substances have high addictive potential and a risk of overdose. Nearly 40 percent of teens who abuse prescription medication obtain the drugs from their parents' medicine cabinet.

Methamphetamine—meth for short—is a white, bitter powder. Sometimes it's made into a white pill or a clear or white shiny rock (called a crystal). Meth powder can be eaten or snorted up the nose. It can also be mixed with liquid and injected into your body with a needle. Crystal meth is smoked in a small glass pipe. Meth at first causes a rush of good feelings, but then those who use it feel edgy, overly excited, angry, or afraid. Meth speeds up breathing and raises blood pressure and can make people hyperactive. People who use meth often scratch their skin, causing sores. They might have burns on their lips or fingers from holding a hot

meth pipe.

Heroin is becoming more popular among teens and is highly addictive as it enters the brain, crossing the blood-brain barrier rapidly. Over time, teens and others who abuse heroin develop a tolerance to the drug, meaning that they need more heroin to get high. Addiction to heroin occurs easily, as does physical dependence on the drug. Heroin withdrawal can happen as quickly as two hours after the last drug use. Heroin can kill the first time used.

Teens may also abuse over-the-counter medications. The substance dextromethorphan (DXM), a cough suppressing substance, is found in many common cold and flu medicines. DXM can cause intoxicating effects in high doses, and an overdose is a real possibility.

Inhalants are also a very popular way, especially with younger adolescents, for getting high. And inhalants could be anything that they could use. It could be an air freshener, or maybe even aerosol cans like computer duster or even whipped cream cans. And how they do that is through the aerosol that comes in them. Inhalants can be anything—even gasoline, or office whiteout liquid. It pays to really be aware of what is going on with your child on this one, especially if you are missing things or smell chemicals on your children or their clothes.

What is a "marijuana wet cigarette"? A marijuana wet cigarette is a marijuana joint that has been dipped in embalming fluid. What the kids are doing is dipping the marijuana cigarette in that fluid. It produces hallucinations. It also produces paranoia, and it can be very deadly.

What we really want to focus on is educating our children on the dangers of doing these drugs. Talking to your kids about staying healthy, and making safe choices is important to the well-being of the whole family.

Keep an eye out for plants that produce a lot of pollen and try to remove them from your property or avoid them during pollen season. Do not pull goldenrod though! Many of the allergies blamed on goldenrod are actually caused by ragweed. This is because though goldenrod does have pollen, its particles are smooth and round, whereas ragweed's are coarse and rough, irritating eyes and sinuses. Goldenrod is important for pollinators so it's a great plant to have on your property.


