On Saturday, Emma Schuette claimed the USA Level 5 grand championship with a 9.35 on the bars while pulling off a clean sweep with victories on the vault, beam, floor and all around. Lola Patton was the USA Level 6 beam Grand Champion with a score of 9.1. Additionally, Reese Chambers and Lindsey Hammond each received the Judges Award for their outstanding character.

In Friday's AAU Silver session, Reagan Gwynn was first on the vault with a 9.4 and third all-around with a 35.675. Shy'Ann Beasley was first on the beam, scoring a 9.35. She also placed first all-around with



a total of 37 points. Abby Brown a 9.225 and second all-around

Madelyn Earley tied for second on the vault (8.825), tied for third on the floor (9.1) and was third all-around (35.675). Keely Shook was third on the bars (9.425) and the beam (8.65); Hammond tied for third on floor with a 9.10.

Kara Lodge's 8.7 on the was first on the vault, recording beam was good enough for second, Grace Rice tied for third with a 9.10 on the floor, while Emma Modlock's 9.30 gave her a third-place finish on the floor.

The AAU Silver squad consists of Beasley, Brown, Davis, Earley, Gwynn, Hammond, Modlock, Rice, Shook, and Addison Harkins.
