continued from Page 4A pesticides have a mode of action. The mode of action is the specific way that a pest is killed by the pesticide. If you use the same mode of action over and over, eventually you will have resistance to it. Rotating modes of action means that you keep switching things up on the pest, and so they will be less likely to become resistant. Pesticides have made it simple tell which mode of action you're using by creating a number system. Each mode of action has its own number associated with it. If you rotate the numbers, you'll rotate the modes of action.

Pesticide resistance is something that anyone who uses pesticides needs to be aware of. Some pesticides are going to be more susceptible to resistance than others are.

to fund the activities and is administrating the grants for these programs. Most of these national grant funds originate with the US Forest Service because the agency believes that it is cheaper to prevent wild fires than to try to put them out and a forest where a wildfire didn't happen looks a whole lot better than one where one did.

When the Towns' Firewise USA, Ready-Set-Go and FAC programs passed to the Citizen's coalition, they began to take the lessons learned in Towns to start new Firewise Communities in surrounding areas using FAC, RSG, and Firewise USA resources to build the programs in these atrisk areas. Plans are to spread the programs that started here in Towns across the south. Programs are presently working up the Appalachians in North Carolina and Virginia Each new community is a unique challenge, but the essentials are the same so development in each new community becomes easier. A program such as this must have a spark and be properly fueled by the citizens that it is designed to protect, and once ignited, will spread on its own through the grassroots channels. Help us fuel this fire, become the spark and get involved and be Firewise! Your life may depend on it! Come out to the meeting on April 16th and learn what you can do to help prevent wildfires.
