Paris, Conley sign National Day of Prayer Proclamation ahead of May 2 event

The 2019 National Day of Prayer will take place on Thursday, May 2, and residents can observe the occasion locally with a special gathering at First Baptist Blairsville, starting at 6:30 p.m.

Organizers of the local event commemorated the upcoming prayer session by joining Union County Sole Commissioner Lamar Paris and Blairsville Mayor Jim Conley for a proclamation signing on Thursday, April 18.

The proclamation declared Thursday, May 2, as a Day of Prayer in Union County, and by extension, the City of Blairsville.

Paris hosted the signing at his office in the Union County Courthouse, and joining him were Mayor Conley, Richard and Sharon Morrison, and

pastors George Kline of Antioch Baptist Church, Bill Schakat of Redeemer Baptist Church and Lutheran Church.

"It is fitting and proper to give thanks to God by observing a day of prayer in Union County

when all may acknowledge our blessings and express gratitude for them, while recognizing the Dave Wesche of All Saints need for strengthening religious and moral values in our state

"The 2019 theme, "In 1988, legislation 'Unity,' is based on Ephesians 4:3, which says, 'Make every peace.

The Prayer Guide issued by the National Day of Prayer Task Force urges people to pray for unity in the seven centers of influence in America, namely the government, the military. the media arts, business, education, the church and the family.'

At the close of the proclamation meeting, Paris, Conley, Cline, Schakat, Wesche and the Morrisons made a circle holding hands as Richard Morrison led a prayer.

Carter arrested in Clay County, North Carolina, after 7 months on the run

After eluding authorities for more than seven months, Crystal LeAnne Carter of Hiawassee was taken into custody by the Clay County, North Carolina, Sheriff's Office on Tuesday, April 16.

Investigators with the Towns County Sheriff's Office and the Georgia Bureau of Investigation have since been to speak with Carter, who is currently awaiting extradition to Georgia, said Kim Williams, Special Agent in Charge of GBI Region 8.

Carter is wanted in connection with the Sept. 8, 2018, shooting of William Craig Henderson.

According to the victim's

statement, the shooting took place on Lindsay Lane, which is in Union County but has a Young Harris mailing address.

Within hours of Henderson arriving at Chatuge Regional Hospital in Hiawassee with a gunshot wound to the chest, the Towns County Sheriff's Office had filed warrants on Carter for aggravated assault and criminal attempt to commit murder.

The Sheriff's Office also requested GBI assistance at the time, which shortly thereafter became the lead agency investigating the case.

Further investigation revealed that the crime most likely occurred in Union County, and the GBI, after receiving assistance from the Union County Sheriff's Office,

took out an aggravated assault warrant for Carter in Union County on Sept. 11, 2018.
