#### vice in Union County?

A. Union General Hospital and Union County Government share in the costs. There are no out of pocket costs to the user. You also do not need to sign up or fill out any forms.

#### Q. How exactly is the bill paid?

A. Generally, a bill will be delivered to the patient's home and the "membership" covers all costs not covered by your personal medical insur-ance, Medicare, or Medicaid. If you receive a bill for this portion you need to contact the company to provide evidence that you do in fact live in Union

County or have a home here, on or before June 1, 2020. Q. Can I decide to use

the membership to be transported to another hospital in the helicopter versus being transported by ambulance?

A. No. The hospital and doctors determine if it is medically necessary for a patient to be transported by helicopter or by ambulance to another hospital. The helicopter is reserved for life and death emergencies and is utilized when a patient needs to get to a different facility as fast as possible. The membership with Air Methods only covers medically necessary flights.

citrus oil and soaps too. One issue with using these is that if you use them too much, they'll damage your soil. Recipes with citrus oil are really more of a biocide, meaning they'll kill plants, insects, earthworms, or anything else it meets. That's not to say don't use them, but rather use them judiciously. A natural product designed to kill is dangerous to the environment when it's not used responsibly.

Shallow tillage is a great way to control weeds in row middles. Or, making your rows wide enough so that you can fit between them with a lawnmower allows you to remove weeds. Hand hoeing is hard work but very effective. I find that holding the hoe at a high angle and using the corner of the blade allows me to get just under the crown of the weed and pull it out. It also helps save your back.

I still hear his voice and the sounds of coon hunts long past. I can almost hear the panthers that lived under the bluffs along Turkey Creek. I can smell the Honeysuckle (Native azaleas) along the tops of the limestone bluffs. The land that I purchased from Papa is more than just land from which we can make money. It is part of the Cummings Family and our soul. It is our history.

In last week's column, I wrote about my family's voting history. I wrote that my family voting Republican began with Abe Lincoln prior to the Civil War. However, I have learned this week that Lincoln wasn't even on the ballot in many southern states, including Alabama. Therefore, I was wrong. I misunderstood the family stories given to me. And I know that we now vote Republican and have for many years.

I also know that my ancestors and many in Winston County Alabama did fight for the Union during the war.
