

# Seven MGC gymnasts advance to Regionals in Daytona Beach, FL

In April, seven gymnasts from Blairsville's Mountain Gymnastics Center qualified for the USA Xcel Southeast Regional Meet in Daytona Beach Fl., where 11-year old Lola Patton tallied first place scores of 37.6 (all-around) and 9.575 (beam).

Meanwhile, MGC picked up a State title when 8-year old Emma Schuette placed first on the vault (9.575), the floor (9.45), and all-around (37.5) at the AAU State Championship meet in May.

As for the seven qualifiers for the USA Xcel Regionals, three advanced by placing first at State. Nine-year olds Lillian Peacock and Avery Frechette, along with 13-year old Annalyse Kiernan each brought home a first-place finish at the USA Xcel Gold State Championships.

Peacock, Frechette, and Kiernan's scores helped them qualify for USA Xcel Regiona 8 Championships. Joining the USA Xcel State champions were an additional four qualifiers for the USA Xcel Region 8 (Southeast, USA) meet in Daytona Beach, FL. These include 11-year old Lola Patton, 12-year old Josie Poston, 14-year old Mia McCombs, and 16-year old Erin Raper.

In the USA Gold State meet, Peacock was first on the beam with a 9.425 and second all-around with a 37.375. Frechette was first on the vault with a score of 9.35 and fourth all-around at 36.325.

Kiernan was first on the beam with a 9.325 boosting her all-around score to 36.26 - good enough for ninth. Patton's 9.50 was second on the bars and her 36.45 all-around was sixth-best. Poston placed eighth in all four events and

In order to advance to recorded an all-around score of floor and Raper tying for fourth eighth all-around with a 36.05. In USA Platinum, Raper was third on the vault and floor, while Mc-Combs placed second on the bars and second all around.

Other outstanding scores for the USA Xcel State Championships were Bre Arp who placed fourth on bars with a 9.45; Madison Pelfrey tied for eighth on beam with a 8.95; Jacey Lee placed seventh with a 8.7 on beam and Kiersten Queen came back from an injury to finish well with a 33.9. Along with Schuette, MGC

In AAU Silver, 11-year old Reese Chambers was second on bars with a 9.425. Thirteen-year old Krissy Garrett tied for 8th on vault with a score of 8.95. Elevenyear old Navaeh Leopold tied for 6th on vault with an 8.9.

In AAU Bronze, 9-year old Millie Banks was 14th all-around with a score of 35.625. Nine-year old Samantha Blackwell was third on vault with a 9.125. Eight-year old Kara Lodge placed seventh on beam with a 9.325. Nine-year old Adriana Viera tied for fifth on floor with a 9.35.

In AAU Level 2, five-year old Keely Shook took home third on floor with a 9.35 and 8-year old Reagan Gwynn tied for 7th on floor with an 8.75.
