is 5" off the floor, but that is a huge difference from sleeping on the floor. In fact, many of the inmates prefer this. The writer further stated that, "...no one deserves to be treated like an animal or an inferior human being regardless of their criminal behavior...'

All inmates are treated with respect in Union County. They are properly clothed, properly fed, have recreation opportunities and free healthcare provided by an outside medical service that does an excellent job.

All of this is at a tremendous cost to the taxpayers. Further, I think more than most, I do fully understand that all inmates are not true criminals. Many are in jail because they have an addiction which therefore causes them to get in trouble they otherwise would

not be involved in. I certainly have compassion for these folks. In fact, in this last week's NGN, the Sheriff's Office in a sting operation, arrested 37 people on drug charges. All were not addicts, but many were. Union County and the state of Georgia spends a tremendous amount of money and man power working through our Accountability Courts System to try to help rehabilitate these people that will accept help. It is working. The state of Georgia pumps over half a million dollars into the accountability court system in our four-county circuit annu-

I attend most of the drug court graduations (a two-year process). These previous inmates in our jail are now on the road to complete recovery, joining their families and society once again. The county, under my direction, just recently completed and dedicated a new \$200,000 Drug Treatment Center as part of the Accountability Court system, to further assist those addicts trying to help themselves.

So, while I am sorry the "letter to the editor" author was so upset with me and the criminal justice system as a whole, maybe if he would take the time to find out what is really going on, he would understand that a lot of people, including our Governor, Legislature and Judges, are trying very hard to help those who have been unsuccessful helping themselves, but now want a fresh start. But simply using the fact that some of the inmates occasionally have to sleep on a mattress on (near) the floor of the jail as evidence of a lack of compassion by me or anyone else, is completely in error.

I drove the 20 miles back home in second gear. The trip must have taken me two hours. It was well after supper when I walked into the house and heard Mom say, "He and his Dad will be there soon to pick

Mom was upset with me and Leman. She was mad at Leman because his raft had broken up just as he hit the Tennessee River. He had not traveled one mile until his raft came apart and Leman had to swim 200 yards to the bank.

She was mad at me because I had driven all the way home (through downtown Russellville) to get home. My Mom always had a hard time understanding the dreams of old men and young boys.

Appointments are necessary and a parent must accompany the child being tested.

Instant drug screens are very accurate and look for the metabolite of a drug in body fluids. If you are trying to find out if your kids indulged in any of the more common street drugs within the last 3 days, you are 99.6 percent likely to get an accurate result. If the drug screen says negative, but you doubt the results, always follow your own good parental instincts. A negative test could mean that the kid is doing drugs that aren't on the test. Standard drug tests don't cover every possibility.

Most positive tests can be followed up with confirmation testing at a lab, especially if you haven't gotten the real truth out of the kid as to exactly which drug and how much that you are dealing with. We have found that many kids that are doing drugs recreationally will pretty much take anything they are given- and something will show up on a test. What we mean is, if they took LSD, they likely smoked some pot too. Instant drug screens are a great tool for parents to begin to get to the whole truth. They also help to start a dialog about drugs, as well as an opening to lay down rules about drugs.
