Softball: Shockers shock at GSA World Series

Homer - Local fastpitch softball standouts are making the most of their limited options during the recent sports slowdown.

Last month, the 16-andunder Shockers travel team, whose roster consists mostly of Union County players, traveled to Homer to take part in the 18-and-under division of the 2020 Global Sports Authority (GSA) World Series. Despite playing against older girls and dropping their second game of pool play, the Shockers earned their nickname by rattling off four-straight victories to claim the GSA World

"We just played amazing; it's one of those moments you will never forget," Shockers coach George Burnette said. "We played great defense and hit the ball great. The pitching was really good too.'

In the title game, the Shockers knocked off Nitro Fastpitch, a squad made up entirely of 18-year olds, according to Burnette.

"Nitro were all 18," he said. "Half of their team had already graduated high school and we beat them with a bunch of eighth, ninth and 10th grad-

With the Shockers leading 6-1 in the second inning of the final game, lightning forced an early resolution to the contest. However, the Shockers were in the tournament driver's seat, already owning a 5-4 come-frombehind win over Nitro in the previous round. As a result, Nitro had to battle their way out of the loser's bracket to earn another shot at the Shockers, and would've needed two victories to claim the crown.

But the Shockers weren't having it - ending Nitro's upset hopes right off the bat. Literally.
