all the way back to the house. One day while playing in the front yard of the Baker house the two girls noticed the preacher walking up the road. You guessed it, the man was the one and only Tom Clark. Athel looked at Mom and said, "I have always heard that man is my Daddy. I have asked and asked and nobody will tell me the truth." So, the young 13 year old girl walked up to Tom Clark and point blank asked, "Preacher Tom are you my Daddy?" Tom Clark would not even look at Athel while he denied being her Daddy.

Everyone in the community knew that Athel didn't have an active Daddy. Some people took advantage of the fact. For example, the Enterprise School out close to Gray Rock was a 3 room school house. The teacher's name escapes my Mother. However, she described him as a short chubby fellow who was

One particular day some of the local boys did something wrong and this short, chubby teacher could not prove the boys did the deed. The old man became angry and he took his anger out on Athel, because he knew Athel did not have a Daddy to take up for her. So, while the teacher was in a foul mood he gave Athel a whipping which left her bruised and bleeding.

Athel would never complain to Dad or Alvie. So, her cousin, my mother, went home and told her mother. MawMaw called her brother T. D. Baker. He was an imposing man. I remember him as being tall with long arms and really big hands. But, I also remember him as very caring about those he loved. He visited the teacher and for some reason the chubby little man left Enterprise never to teach in the local community again. Mom told me that the man was also very cruel to the Taylor boys who had also lost their Daddy at a young age. I always figured that a man which would take out his anger on children was not fit to work as a teacher anyway.

Twenty years later Athel left this world as a young mother. She too had young children. You might think Athel's life is a true tragedy. But, when her name is mentioned around our family everyone's eyes brighten and their memories reveal a young girl that was the apple of their eye. A hush falls around the room because everyone knows that none can live up to the life she led.

ture and the risks of substance use to brain development.

Everyone agrees that substance use has an impact on behaviors, but little is discussed with respect to the impact on the brain. In the same way we've come to recognize the negative consequences that a mother's drinking or smoking can have on a developing fetus, research has progressed such that we now know there are distinct risks to teen brain development with substance use.

Consider the construction of a house as a metaphor for how the brain develops. First the foundation is poured, followed by framing, wiring and plumbing over the course of time. The brain develops in a similar way, with the foundation being laid in the early years before birth and into the early years of childhood. Adolescence is another time of rapid brain development where the brain's framing and wiring become more efficient and the brain develops skills to focus, prioritize and problem-solve. The brain is not fully developed until a person's mid-20's, making it more vulnerable to the impact of drinking and drug

Alcohol and other drugs can damage the brain's wiring, increasing the likelihood of learning difficulties and health problems in adulthood. Just as a house is still functional with a cracked foundation and faulty wiring, so is the human brain, but neither is optimal.

For some teens, this can show up as anxiety or depression later in life, a lower GPA than expected, taking longer to finish school or dropping out altogether in high school or college. Teens who are more

vulnerable to "faulty wiring," typically have certain risk factors which make them more likely to develop a substance use disorder. These risk factors include: Family history of problems related to substance use; Underlying mental health problems; Trauma; Bullying; and Impulse control problems.

So what can you do, especially in a culture where drinking and drug use is so common? Encourage your teen to delay, delay when it comes drug and alcohol use. Assist your son or daughter in engaging in healthy activities and social circles. Teens are going to take risks, push boundaries and make mistakes. Help them find healthy ways to try new things, push limits and

Many parents believe that using drugs and drinking normal experimentation. Help your teen develop strong coping skills for life's stressors. Model healthy behaviors. After a stressful day, instead of reaching for a glass of wine or beer, try going for a walk, deep breathing or other healthy relaxation techniques. Acknowledge and positively reinforce decisions to not use drugs or

If your child is "experimenting," it's time to start talking. Have a conversation about what he or she sees as the benefits of using alcohol or other drugs. Reasons for use often include thrill seeking, escaping boredom, social pressure to fit in, escape from problems or easing anxiety. Finding healthy alternatives that address her reasons and compete with substance use can move a teen in the direction of lowered use or abstinence.

animals of the pine woods are accustomed to frequent fires and depend on these fires for their survival. Fire is as natural as sunshine, rain and wind in many plant communities including upland pine, pine flatwoods, marshes and wet prairies. Fire also benefits many of the rare animal species in our state that are declining. Some of these declines are caused almost totally by fire exclusion. Frequent fires prevent the build-up of flammable fuels in the forest that set the stage for destructive wildfires when ignition does occur.

the fire to be confined to a pre-

determined area and accomplishes one or more planned land management objectives, or to mitigate catastrophic wildfires." Georgia Prescribed Burning Act, 1992. Prescribed burning is carried out by experienced, trained, and certified land managers on both public and private lands throughout Georgia. These professionals assess forest conditions, determine the type of fire needed, and then write a "prescription" for the application of fire. Prescribed burns are permitted by the Georgia Forestry Commission (GFC) District Offices depending upon predicted weather conditions and safety measures to be used. GFC also offers a Certified Burner Manager Program that serves to enhance the skills of land managers and acquaint burners with regulations and offer opportunities for more advanced training. Smoke from prescribed fires is a sign that certain lands are being cared for properly. Great care is taken by prescribed fire managers to minimize any temporary inconveniences created by smoke. Smoke management plans for prescribed burns are designed so that smoke-sensitive areas like roads and residences, etc., are not negatively affected by the burn.

Smoke from prescribed fires does not contribute appreciably to air quality issues since the practice typically avoids times of stagnant summer air. However, uncontrolled wildfires usually occur during the summer when there is already a bad urban air quality problem. We can reduce the risk of wildfires and the resulting smoke or air quality problems with well-timed prescribed fires. No other tool can so effectively remove the hazardous buildup of woodland fuels and help maintain our forests.

age to the tree. If you decide to apply an insecticide one containing Bacillus thuringiensis (Bt) or spinosad will kill the webworms and not beneficial insects that are also nearby. Broad-spectrum insecticides like pyrethroids, which are any insecticide with an active ingredient ending with -thrin, will kill any insects it meets. You will have to open the nest first so that you get the insecticide inside the web. As always, read the label before applying a pesticide so that you know how to properly handle and apply the pesticide.
