As usual, Knight's office is doing well with tax collections, with 99.92 percent of 2017 taxes collected, and 96.94 percent collections on last year's taxes. Hill also asked

According to the system's new "COVID-19 Weekly Update," as of Friday, Aug. 21, four students and two staff had current COVID-19 diagnoses, with 66 students and 19 staff quarantined for possible exposure.
