## Softball: Rain cancels much-anticipated clashes with Commerce and Heard Latest GHSA statement includes modification to postseason dates and Columbus host site

Fifth-ranked Union County's week of Top-10 showdowns suffered a washout via Mother Nature.

Monday's trip to No. 4 Commerce and Saturday's doubleheader vs. No. 6 Heard County were canceled due to rain. As of Monday's deadline, Union's visit to No. 10 East Hall later in the day was still

The Lady Panthers will play host to rival Fannin County on Thursday with a 5 p.m. first pitch. Next Monday, Aug. 31. Union County will travel to Lumpkin County for the season rubber match. The 8th-ranked Lady Indians split a twin bill at UCHS on Aug. 8 to open

Region play is slated to begin Sept. 10 when Union hosts the defending State Champion and top-ranked Banks County.

Although, 2020 has been an up-and-down year for the Lady Leopards, so far. At 2-2, Banks County opened with a 14-2 loss to East Hall and a 5-1 defeat at Jefferson.

Since the 0-2 start, they've picked up a pair of victories (13-6 and 3-2) over Stephens County. Meanwhile, Rabun

County, last year's No. 4 seed from 8-AA, is sitting at 3-2 with one-sided losses to Hart County (10-1) and White Coun-

On the flip-side, the Lady Cats own blowout wins over Clarke Central (10-1 and 8-3) and Cherokee Bluff (20-3).

The fourth and final region squad, Elbert County, is winless at 0-5 while being outscored 50-9 on the year.
