Jason Waldroup, a 15year resident of Towns County, will now face Rogers in the seat that Vice Chairman Steven Phillips resigned from for

personal reasons. Danny Henson will seek to unseat Incumbent Charles Jenkins as one of the Union County representatives on the BRMEMC board. However, there are two other candidates seeking that seat in Pirie and

And Jeff Ledford hopes to unseat Incumbent Chris Logan as one of the Clay County, North Carolina, representatives on the BRMEMC board. He also must beat Preston Cabe.

Henson was a board member for a short while in 2015. The BRMEMC Board of Directors disqualified him because of a business partnership with then fellow board member Greg Owenby.

Today, Henson is back, ready to seek another seat on the board. This time, Henson was nominated by the EMC's Nominating Committee to again earn a seat on the Board. Pirie, White and incumbent Charles Jenkins, also in the race for the Union County seat, join Henson on the ballot.

Jenkins rode the wave of petition ballot winners in 2014. He has almost completed his first term as a board member.

Pirie currently is a substitute teacher for Union County Schools. She and her family attend First Baptist Church of Blairsville, where she is a member of the choir and volunteers as the choir teacher for 3-year-olds. White is a lifelong

resident of Union County. He attended Woody Gap School, went to North Georgia College, and graduated from the University of Georgia.

He is past president of the Union County Saddle Club. He has managed consumer finance offices and is now selfemployed at Budget Propane in Suches. He and his wife Susan have two daughters.

In Towns County. Waldroup and his wife Sonya have two children, Alexis and Tristan. They attend Macedonia Baptist Church and have called Towns County home for the

past 15 years.

Rogers is a lifelong resident of Towns County. He and his wife Diane have two daughters and three grandchildren. They attend Macedonia Baptist Church.

Meanwhile, in Clay County, Ledford, a life-long resident of Clay County, North Carolina, is currently the Used Car Manager at Ware Chevrolet in Blairsville.

Cabe is a lifelong resident of Clay County, North Carolina. He graduated from Hayesville High School in 1994. He has been married to Amanda Smith from Blairsville for 15 years, and they have two daughters, Kaitlyn and Maci Cabe. They are members of Mountain Grace Baptist Church in Clay County, North Carolina.

Logan, who also won election by way of petition ballot in 2014, presently serves as treasurer of the BRMEMC, chairman of the Finance Committee, and serves on the North Georgia Network Board of Directors.

BRMEMC General Manager Jeremy Nelms said any misunderstanding associated with the 2017 Directors election is a result of questions about the proper qualifications required for a member to be eligible to serve as a director.

While the bylaws are quite clear in most requirements, they are void of any clear definition of "member in good standing," and the board is taking steps to clarify that requirement for the membership's consideration in 2018 at the Annual Meeting. The Board of Directors

doesn't vote on who is on the ballot, that's a decision by the Credentials Committee, said the EMC Board Secretary Roy Perren. The Credentials

Committee received direction by internal and external legal counsel to judge the nomination process by payment history, thus the "member in good standing" confusion regarding candidates.

According to Perren, the EMC board intends to offer amendments to the

bylaws that more clearly define candidate qualifications in order to eliminate any confusion in future elections.

However, the earliest opportunity to do that would be the 2018 Annual Meeting, due to specific notification requirements for amending corporate bylaws.

"We wouldn't be able to get it ready for this year's Annual Meeting," Perren said.


