we can to keep you safe."

During the commission of the Aug. 31 Marathon burglary, the individuals involved were captured on camera walking about outside the store in their masks before breaking in. Once inside the store, the criminals crawled around flat on the ground using their elbows and knees, leading the sheriff's office to dub them the "Crawling Thugs" in a Facebook post.

The sheriff's office is also looking for a suspicious vehicle believed to have been acting as a lookout during the burglary, and is asking for

people to come forward who may have seen such a vehicle in the vicinity of the store, Tate Road or the North Carolina state line between 2 a.m. and 4 a.m. on Aug. 31.

The sheriff's office has developed what they are calling a "person of interest" concerning the case, a man named Julio Antonio Piloto, who is wanted for similar crimes out of Polk County,
