• 10:28 a.m.: The North Tower collapsed, leaving the 16-acre World Trade Center site in ruins and collateral damage affecting all adjacent properties and streets. The rescue effort commenced immediately as we all watched our TV's at home here and around the world in horror.

toilets and showerheads can reduce the amount of stress that you put on your septic system. Select the proper load size on your washing machine to avoid overloading your septic system. If you can, spread your clothes washing throughout the week. Doing all of your laundry in one day will put a lot of water through your septic system at one time.

Finally, a professional should inspect the average household septic system at least every three years. Typically, it will need to be pumped

every three-five years.

rescue calls, hazmat, and second medical calls. Engine 1 is the main fire apparatus and responds to all fires, hazmat, and motor vehicle accidents. Ladder 1 is a Quint apparatus with a 75-foot ladder, 1,500 gpm pump, and rescue equipment. It responds to all commercial incidents.

Wildland 1 is a Ford pickup with water tank and pump for fighting wildland fires.
