drug combinations are comparable to a game of Russian

roulette. Alcohol and Benzodi**azepines:** Benzodiazepines (Valium, Xanax and Ativan) are the most common drugs mixed with alcohol.

Unfortunately, this combination is also one of the most lethal. Both alcohol and benzodiazepines slow down the central nervous system. When combined, the central nervous is affected twice as hard, which can lead to severe loss of coordination, coma and significantly increase the risk of overdose and death.

Alcohol and Opiates: Alcohol and opiates also make for a particularly lethal combination, since each one enhances the sedative effects of the other. Much like benzodiazepines, illegal opiates like heroin and prescription opioids (Oxycontin, Vicodin, hydrocodone) seriously depress the central nervous system. Both alcohol and opiates slow down breathing in different physical ways. Along with this one-two punch to breathing, both substances inhibit coughing reflexes. Not surprisingly, respiratory arrest

this combination. Alcohol and Stimulants: Unlike alcohol/benzodiazepines or alcohol/opiate combinations, the combination of alcohol and stimulants coun-

teracts each substance's effects to an extent. In other words, stimu-

lants (cocaine, speed, meth, Ritalin, Adderall) mask the depressive effects of alcohol, while alcohol dulls the "edge"

This significantly increases the risk of taking more than your body can handle.

Also, when you mix cocaine and alcohol, your body creates a by product called cocaethylene in the liver, a dangerous chemical compound that increases the chances of overdose.

Like a game of Russian roulette, mixing alcohol and drugs commonly produces tragic results.

Regardless of a person's tolerance, the human body cannot handle the powerful effects of certain combinations.

Although mixing any alcohol and drug combination is dangerous, no one should risk their life on any of these three combinations.

Alabama was trying to pull itself out of a depression and there was talk of an impending war. He finally found a job with a logger. Early one cold morning
