A. In most cases, a U.S. Highway is funded by the federal government, although the state has to pitch in a certain percentage on projects and maintenance. Whereas a State Route (SR) is funded and maintained by the State of Georgia.

Usually, you cannot tell the difference in the highway except by the type of signage that is used. The signage for a U.S. Highway is a number inside a shield, and State Routes are identified as the State Route number in an outline of the State of Georgia.

Q. Do you have the distances of the highways here in Union County?

A. U.S. Highway 19/129 South (Gainesville Hwy) =

19/129 North (Murphy Hwy) = 10.65 miles; U.S. Highway 19/129 (Glenn Gooch Bypass) = 0.86 miles; SR 515 (Blue Ridge Hwy) = 9.39 miles; SR 515 (Young Harris Hwy) = 6.28 miles; SR 180 (SR 60 in Suches to Towns County line) = 18.36 miles; SR 180 Spur (Up to Brasstown Bald) = 0.7miles; SR 60 (Fannin Co to Lumpkin Co in Suches) = 10.57 miles; SR 348 (Richard Russell Scenic Highway from SR 180 to White County line) = 7.01miles; SR 325 (SR 515 to U.S. 19/129) = 11.09 miles; County Roads Asphalt = 376.54 miles; County Roads Surface Treatment = 57.15 miles; County Roads Gravel = 105.73 miles; Private Roads = 484.58 miles.

According to Linda Richter, director of policy research and analysis with the National Center on Addiction and Substance Abuse, the findings "solidly confirm what front-line health care and law enforcement professionals in towns and cities across the country know from firsthand experience: deadly synthetic opioids like fentanyl are now the main drivers of drug overdose deaths in the United States."

Richter warned that "these drugs are about 50 times more potent than heroin and up to 100 times more potent than morphine. It only takes a tiny amount of the drug to cause a deadly reaction."

The greatest risk is borne by people who use other opioids, such as heroin or prescription painkillers. Looking at heroin specifically, about 37 percent of all overdose deaths also involved synthetic opioids in 2016, up from just 1.5 percent in 2010, the researchers said.

Synthetic opioids were implicated in more than 40 percent of all cocaine overdose deaths in 2016, up from 4 percent in 2010.

Benzodiazepine users also were at increased risk, with 31 percent of overdose deaths involving a drug like fentanyl in 2016 compared with less than 12 percent in 2010, according to the report. Common benzodiazepines include Valium and Ativan.

People might not know they are taking fentanyl when they buy heroin or cocaine, since drug dealers frequently cut those substances with much cheaper synthetic opioids. Large numbers of counterfeit pills also have started flooding the illicit drug market. These pills look like oxycodone, Percocet, Xanax or other prescription drugs, but are actually pressed fentanyl.

Prince, the late rock music star, is perhaps the highestprofile victim of counterfeit fentanyl. Law enforcement officials said his accidental 2016 death from fentanyl was traced to a look-alike, counterfeit version of the opioid painkiller Vicodin, which Prince had been taking for chronic hip pain, according to published reports.

"Some people may think, 'This is fentanyl, I've used it before and I haven't overdosed,' but the next day it could be some other analogue of fentanyl that is more potent, she explained. "If they're using the same amount, it would be a much higher risk for overdose.' Richter said that this latest development shows that past efforts to curb the opioid epidemic, such as prescription drug monitoring, now "are largely missing the mark." Instead, she suggested that we need a comprehensive approach

Prevention efforts that start with young children and a significantly overhauled addiction-treatment system will be key to addressing the opioid epidemic, as well as any future crises involving drug abuse, Richter said.

"Finally, we need to eliminate the stigma around this very preventable and treatable disease so that those who need help get the care they deserve without being shunned as criminals or sacrificing their human dignity," she said.

In the meantime, experts suggest that lives can be saved through broader distribution of the anti-overdose medica-

plications or removing the infected leaves. Spider mites and aphids can be pests of mums. They can be controlled by insecticides, but good coverage of the plant is necessary to control these pests. Spider mites and aphids are capable of population explosions in a very short amount of time, therefore make sure that you completely cover the top and bottom of the leaves when spraying for these pests.
