

## Garrett brings new philosophy to a hungry Lady Panthers squad

For the first time since 2011, the Lady Panthers will be under the direction of a new head coach as Corey Garrett takes over a Union County squad that returns four starters, led by two-time All-Region selection Bailey Daniel.

Last season the Lady Panthers (12-14, 4-8) failed to reach the state tournament for the first time in 7 years following a 2-8 start in region play (one win came by forfeit over GAC). Relying heavily on freshmen and sophomores, the Lady Panthers went through some early growing pains but closed with wins over Lumpkin County and at Dawson County

Unfortunately, Union made an early departure from the postseason when Dawson got revenge a week later to halt the Lady Panthers' postseason streak at six years.

Returning alongside the aforementioned Daniel is a two-year starter in junior Adeline Dockrey, who is perhaps the most versatile player on the roster. The frontcourt will be anchored by double-double machine Kait McCarter. The sophomore post was an All-Region selection as a freshman last season after proving herself a steady scorer and rebounder.

Fellow sophomore Brooke Dockrey, a part-time Hayesville, NC on Tuesday for starter at guard last season was also a significant contributor as a freshman.

## Jones to lean heavily on experience as Panthers return four starters

Union County basketball opens its 2017-18 campaign this week with a Tuesday scrimmage at Hayesville, NC, followed by the season-opener on Friday when the Panthers welcome Gilmer County.

Head Coach Casey Jones, who begins his fifth year at the helm, is looking for a postseason berth after missing out on



a spark off the bench during his sophomore season.

'We have some freshmen this year that I really like but I don't know if any of them will be ready to play any varsity," Jones said.

Senior Cole Wright, a part-time starter last year is not playing, nor is Riley Barrett and Marty Kronz - both came off the bench as juniors last season.

Tuesday's scrimmage at Hayesville will get underway at 5 p.m. with the Lady Panthers game. As for the guys, Jones hopes the game serves as learning experience for his team. Tuesday is a chance to see what we can do and what we can do better," Jones said. 'Like I said, we haven't added anything new so I'm hoping we can just go out an execute and take care of the basketball." On Friday, Union will host Gilmer, who the Panthers narrowly defeated twice last season. The following Tuesday, Nov. 21, Union County visits Towns County, looking to avoid the first three-game losing streak to the Indians in 22 years. Region play begins Dec. 5 with a trip to Fannin County. On Dec. 8, the Panthers will host Rabun County, a former region rival. "We've got some experi-ence but we're kind of small," Jones added. "To be successful we're going to have to shoot it from the outside, try to score on the run as much as we can, and play good defense. "The chemistry is good, we have experience and we have guys who can lead us. Of Patrick Baggett, whose 3-point course it helps when you have

the state tournament for the first time during his tenure following a disappointing finish to 2016-17.

"We're ready to get go-ing," Jones said. "This is always an exciting time of year when the games roll around. We have a good group of guys this year and I'm looking forward to getting started."

The Panthers return four starters off last year's 10-16 squad that opened the season without junior guard Candler Colwell, then finished the year without its leading scorer, senior Lawson Baenninger.

After Baenninger's injury, Union fell at eventual region champ East Hall on Jan. 3 but reeled off four straight wins, including a 59-56 victory over Dawson County to improve to 9-9 on the year. A loss to region runner-up Greater Atlanta Christian and a 19-point drubbing of Hayesville had the Panthers sitting at 10-10 on January 21.

A 66-54 loss at North Hall was followed by a heartbreaking 70-68 loss to East Hall where Union was unable to survive a frantic Viking rally in the final minute.
