Basketball: Lady Panthers enter Thanksgiving break at 3-0

Union County finished the week of Thanksgiving with an undefeated record following Monday's neutral site win over West Hall and a Tuesday night victory at White County.

With three games on the slate this week, the Lady Panthers can move to 6-0 - surpassing last year's five-game streak to start the season.

On Tuesday, Union will host Tallulah Falls before welcoming Towns County for a Friday night rematch. The week will wrap up Saturday with another rivalry showdown at Fannin County. Lady Panthers 56, White

County 51 - Sophomore Ava Hunter recorded a game-high 30 points and senior Kait McCarter scored the contest's final nine points, helping the Lady Panthers (3-0) erase a 51-47 deficit in the final minute to escape Cleveland with a 56-51 victory. After battling foul trouble

all night, McCarter was held scoreless for the game's first 31 minutes, but the senior forward would deliver when it mattered

"I've said so many times that the season will depend upon our senior leadership, and Kait proved that tonight," Union coach Crystal Beach said after the win. "She stepped up for us and she had ice water running through her veins. She was focused, locked in and did exactly what you would expect a senior leader to do.'

Trailing 51-47 with under a minute to play, Union County turned a Lady Warrior miss from the foul line into a McCarter layup on the other end.

With 40 seconds left and still down by two, the Lady Panthers went back to McCarter in the post for the game-tying basket. She would put Union ahead 17 seconds later when she hit 2-for-2 at the line for a 53-51 White County missed a

go-ahead 3-point shot on the other end and McCarter was fouled to stop the clock with 11 seconds left. McCarter would calmly step to the line and sink both shots to open up a 55-51 lead. With the outcome all but decided, McCarter went back to the line with 7 seconds to play and hit 1-of-2 to seal the 56-51

"It was a great feeling to help us get the win," McCarter said following the game. "I'm really proud of all these girls that carried me while I was in foul trouble. A lot of young girls stepped up and proved that we can count on them."

Prior to McCarter's ninepoint outburst in the final minute, Hunter had accounted for 30 of her team's 47 points - and they needed every single one

With McCarter and point guard Brooke Dockrey in foul trouble the entire game and senior Andelin Hill struggling to find her shooting stroke, Hunter was responsible for 10 of Union's 14 field goals through three quarters.

"We (made some adjustments) at halftime and (Andelin Hill) came back out and played great defense for us," Coach Beach said. "I know Brooke fouled out but she kept her composure. This place is a tough playing environment so this win six of the Lady Panthers' first feels good."



its largest lead of the night at 42-35 to end the third, but they were unable to put the Lady Panthers away thanks to a subpar 7-for-17 performance at the charity

Dockrey returned to the floor with four fouls and provided a spark for her squad with five quick points before fouling out just shy of the midway point of the fourth and her team down

After the Lady Warriors missed the front-end of a 1-and-1 attempt, Hunter was fouled down low and sank 2-of-2 at the line to give Union its first lead since the opening frame. Following a 79-second scoring drought by both squads, White County used a three to regain the lead at 49-47 with 2:36 remaining. Seconds later, the Lady Warriors' fullcourt pressure defense forced Union County into a turnover that resulted in an easy layup on the other end for a 51-47 score.

Meanwhile, Hunter scored nine points as they never trailed until the 2:40 mark of the opening frame. With Dockrey and McCarter both on the bench in foul trouble, White County raced ahead 16-11 after one.

Hunter scored her team's first five points of the second quarter to keep it close at 18-16. Freshman Ellie Cook sank a pair at the line to keep the margin at two before the Lady Warriors were able to stretch its lead to 30-25 at the break.

Union scored the first six points of the third with Hunter accounting for five and freshman Corinne Hill splitting a pair at the stripe. After failing to score for the first 5-plus minutes of the second half, White finally got on the board at the 2:52 mark to regain the lead at 32-31. Moments later, Union answered with a Hunter put-back for a 33-32 advantage before the Lady Warriors closed the third with a 10-2 run to build its largest lead at 42-35.

Dockrey finished with 8 points, Cook added four, Rebekah Chambers and Kyla Locklear scored 2 points apiece while Locklear recorded several

Corinne Hill finished with a point to round out the Union County scoring. The Lady Panthers would finish 10-for-19 at the foul line.

Juniors Dasha Cannon and Maddie Futch led the Lady Warriors with 21 and 11 points, respectively. **Notes:** With 30 points at

Up next: Union County and Tallulah Falls (3-2) will get underway Tuesday at 6 p.m. with the guys to follow.

Speaking of the Lady Indians, they will visit Blairsville on Friday night for a 7 p.m. girls

After starting 2-0 with wins over Nantahala. NC and Hiwassee Dam. NC, Towns has dropped back-to-back decisions to Union and Highlands. On Saturday, the Lady
