tem, it is best to call at least a day before to make an appointment for the van to pick you up. Call 706-439-6050; Operates five days per week, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Riders under 12 must be accompanied by an adult 18 or over. Rider must provide a child safety seat for all children under six years of age.

Q. How much does it cost to ride the buses?

A. Fees apply to all riders six and older. Prices listed are for one-way fares.

First Mile – \$3; Each Additional Mile – \$.50

Q. Can I get a reduced rate if I am elderly or disabled?

A. Unfortunately, federal programs such as this do not allow discounted rates. Everyone who rides has to pay the same price if Union County is to continue receiving federal funding.

Q. Will someone come

into my home to help me get into the transportation bus?

A. Though we wish we could accommodate these types of requests, it is not possible. The Union County Transit and all 5311 programs are curb to curb service providers. This means that the individual rider must be able to get out of their home by themselves as well as handle their personal off-location errands. In other words, riders must be able to do their own shopping, etc. The drivers can help passengers from their door and into the bus if necessary, and they will help with the wheelchair lift when necessary. If a passenger requires assistance with shopping or getting into stores or doctors' offices, the rider must have an aid with them to help with these items. If the assistance of an aid is necessary, the aid can ride the bus free of charge.

You may already be using IPM without even realizing it. Using mulch around flower beds or drip irrigation to water can be IPM. If you have a fence around your garden to keep deer and other pests out that is part of IPM. Some ways that you could improve your use of IPM could be spraying insecticides when beneficial insects aren't active. When planting look to see what disease resistance your seeds have or use plants that are from our area, oftentimes those will have natural resistance and be adapted to our climate.

The key to being successful with IPM is to be more conscientious of your surroundings and thinking long term. If you have questions about IPM contact your local county Extension Office or send me an email at Jacob.Williams@uga.edu.

cloud ever recorded. The Brazilian rainforest is regarded as the lungs of the planet for their role in absorbing CO2 and producing O2. The destruction of the rainforest is eliminating "the best natural air cleaning system the planet has supplied us with." Another significant source of methane is rumens. A single cow belches, at both ends, around 100 to 500 liters/ day (about 26-132 gallons/day). Livestock account for 14.5% of total human greenhouse gas emissions. Capturing this CH4 would result in simultaneous environmental and economic benefits.

About 45% of the CO2 in the Troposphere is absorbed by the oceans. This absorbed surplus of CO2 results in undesirable ocean acidification and influences the interactive biological activities. Heat trapped in the atmosphere is also absorbed by the oceans, further increasing its annual water temperature. The oceans are critical in controlling global warming, yet human activities are trashing the oceans.

The economy is the obstacle in the development of procedures for lowering greenhouse gases. USA needs to take the lead in reengineering the global economy.

There are some bright spots, however, with the recent announcements that Jeff Bezos of Amazon.com, Inc. granted \$800 million to 16 groups fighting climate change, and UK has a ban on gas-powered cars by 2030. The list is growing. **Thomas G. Tornabene**
