Early in-person voting for the General and Special Election Runoffs continues this week, though people should keep in mind that voting will not be available Christmas Eve and Day.

Voters are deciding who

Senate seats and, at the state level, who will serve as the next District 4 Public Service Commissioner.

The three weeks of early in-person voting is occurring weekdays at the Union County Courthouse between 8 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. in the Jury Assembly

Paris presents 2021 budget; adoption to occur Dec. 28

Union County Sole Commissioner Lamar Paris held a Dec. 17 public hearing to go over the 2021 Proposed County Budget.

It was a largely uneventful hearing; no one from the public asked any questions about the budget, which was surprising considering the series of contentious tax hearings from earlier in the year concerning the 17% increase in the county's portion of property tax bills.

As with so many things in 2020, the meeting did feature a departure from the norm, as Paris entered in through the back of the usual courtroom meeting place to briefly explain that he'd be holding the bulk of the meeting via teleconference

Paris said he'd recently experienced a secondary exposure to someone who then tested positive for COVID-19, so to protect the public, he would not be leading the meeting in

law requires budget hearings to take place in person, i.e. not with everyone conferenced in via Zoom, and that, in the interest of public health, he would be isolating in his office while

However, Paris said state appearing via a laptop-to-TV setup in the courtroom.

Kicking things off, Paris explained that the budget included additional tax revenues from the increased 2020 millage rate. The
