

Each day of the campaign will address a different winter weather topic. On Monday, Dec. 2, the topic will be "Winter Weather in Georgia," where we learn about winter weather hazards that can impact the state of Georgia and our mountain community. On Tuesday, Dec. 3, the topic is Winter Weather Terminology, where we are reminded of the winter weather "alerts" (watches, warnings and advisories) and what they mean.

The topic for Wednesday, Dec. 4, is Winter Weather Preparation Tips, where citizens learn how to best prepare for winter weather events and put together a Ready Kit while making a plan before winter weather strikes. Thursday, Dec. 5's topic is Winter Weather Driving Tips/Safety. This is where drivers learn "best practices" for driving (if necessary) in winter weather conditions and how to pack a mobile Ready Kit. The last topic on Friday, Dec. 6, is learning the Winter Weather Outlook, where the National Weather service provides resources for learning where and how to stay informed of weather forecasts

To help residents get ready, UCEMA recommends three major actions when it comes to winter weather. First, stay informed by

They and volunteers have delivered over 200 million boxes of Christmas cheer to partner churches around the world. The churches give the gifts to needy children along with a powerful message - God loves you.

That is the meeting of extremes with a human touch. But in a more transcendent way, Christmas embeds into the mind another

meeting of extremes. G.K. Chesterton calls it "the idea of a baby and the idea of unknown strength that sustains the stars." The image of mother and child softens the heart and hints at the mercy of God. The presence of angels and the mysterious guiding star proclaim the startling news that something happened once in human history that has eternal implications. The Christmas story in John's gospel brings together the

immanent and transcendent. "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God... All things came into being through Him" (1:1,3). The Word is God the Creator. What has this to do with Christmas, with mother and child? John adds, "The Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we saw His glory, glory as of the only begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth" (1:14). It is extreme that the Creator entered his creation as a Babe. It had to be so, because the Word is the Savior we need to connect us to God.

The annual Christmas celebration is a reminder of the impact of the historic event. "Omnipotence and impotence, or divinity and infancy, do definitely make a sort of epigram which a million repetitions cannot turn into a platitude," Chesterton writes. "It is not unreasonable to call it unique. Bethlehem is emphatically a place where extremes meet." It is the place where the Light shined in the darkness.

When believers step into the space between the love of God and human need, people find hope that need is not the end of

Commissioner's Questions Q. When does the Winter season officially begin?

A. For 2024, it begins Saturday, December 21, 2024, and it ends on March 20, 2025.

Q. What kind of predications are being made about Winter weather for 2024/2025? A. According to various resources (NOAA-National Oce-

anic and Atmospheric Administration and the Farmer's Almanac), Winter from Union temperatures will be slightly warmer than normal, and below-normal precipitation is expected. The coldest County Commissioner periods will occur from mid-January into early February and in late Feb-

ruary. However, it is predicted we expect above-normal snowfall in the southern Appalachians. The snowiest periods will occur in late December, late February, and early March. We certainly hope that our real snowfall ends up be-

Q. Sometimes snow feels different. Sometimes it feels colder than other times. Why does it feel that way?

A. When snow falls, it is referred to as either a wet or a dry snow. Snow that falls when the temperature is very cold - usually below 28 degrees - would be classified as a dry snow. This type of snow is light and fluffy. This is typically the type of snow you see in Colorado and it is great for skiing. Snow that falls when the temperature is a little warmer - usually 30 to 35 degrees - would be classified as a wet snow. This is the type of snow we often have here. A wet snow is wet to the touch and is great for making snowmen and snowballs since it packs so well. This type of snow also sticks to tree limbs and powerlines causing power outages all over

Q. What is the difference between a dry and wet snow in relation to the difficulty the county has in getting and keeping the roads clear?

A. Dry snow quickly packs on the roads and highways and becomes very difficult to scrape off with our trucks. Normally we spread gravel and salt to help melt the snow to make it easier to remove. The biggest problem is that when cars and trucks drive over the snow, it packs it down. When this happens, it becomes even more difficult to remove with our snowplows. However, this type



Shooting Stars

During the year of Paul's birth, a radio show would have a profound effect upon the lives of both of my grandparents. Orson Welles directed the radio program which caused many of his listeners to panic. The show was called "The War of the Worlds." Although my grand-

parents did not panic at that time, they later panicked in the summer of 1946. Paul was 8 years old and still fragile from his bout with Scarlet Fever. But it was



early fall and the smell of autumn made him feel good. The cotton was nearly ready for harvest and the bolls promised a good yield. The family was happy. After the chores were done they ate supper and Papa went out on the porch to relax in the cool evening. The family was talking when they seen the first one.

It was beautiful as it sailed across the night sky lighting up the northern horizon. Soon the boys saw even more of the shooting stars, and it wasn't long before there were so many of them they couldn't count them all. My grandparents became alarmed because their memories took them back to the radio show in 1938. Coon was a superstitious man, and all he could think of was Martians with ray guns invading the earth. To be fair, my Papa and the rest of the country had been through WWII, and the memory of Pearl Harbor was still fresh on his mind, as were those rockets that the Nazis had developed.

So, Coon and Glenna Mae gathered up their two sons, grabbed a large quilt and made their way from their new house across the cotton field toward the storm cellar of Herman Wynn. Now, Papa was very hesitant about going to the Wynn's storm house because he was always uncomfortable around the man due to him being a Godly man that was always praying for his neighbor's salvation. Papa was a man that did not want to depend upon anyone. He believed in pulling himself up by his bootstraps and doing things himself. He had purchased this 80 acres of land, cleared this cotton field from a stand of timber and paid for everything in a few short years. But, being around Mr. Wynn made him feel inadequate, as if he needed something. Not only was Coon fearful for his family, but he dreaded being around the man.

The family was halfway across the 12acre field when a particularly bright meteor flared above their heads. Instinctively, the family hit the dirt and covered themselves with the large quilt. Their two sons peeked out from under the quilt and later told us kids about the beauty of all those shooting stars. Paul and Bud could not understand why their parents were so



Armadillo

Armadillos are moving further and further north, and have started showing up in the mountains. I've seen them walking through the woods while hiking here. Let's talk about armadillos and the damage that they can cause.

In Georgia, we only have one species of I hat's

armadıllo. the nine-banded armadillo. In Central and South America, there are 20 species of armadillo, including the giant armadillo that can



weigh up to 130 pounds. The ones that we have are about the size of an opossum and weigh 8 to 17 pounds. They are brownish colored with sparse hair. The unique thing about them is the 'shell' that covers them. This shell is made up of bony plates covered by a tough skin layer. The plates overlap giving the armadillo some freedom of movement. Armadillos don't like colo temperatures, which is why they have been slow

to establish populations in the mountains. They will dig burrows or use burrows dug by other animals to sleep in. When it's hot out side, they will limit activity to nighttime. However, when it gets cold, they become more active during the day. They don't hibernate, because they aren't capable of storing body reserves of fat. Therefore, they must forage at least every few days. The burrows usually have an entrance

that's about a foot wide and 4 feet long. They have poor eyesight, but rely on their sense of smell to find food. Their diet is made up of insects and plant litter. Sometimes, you can see parts of what they've eaten in their droppings. Their droppings are round and about the same size as marbles. Most armadillo foraging is done by digging in the ground. When digging they are looking for grubs. They will eat fire ants

and don't mind fire ant bites. Armadillos can carry disease, but transmission of disease to humans is very rare. They can carry leprosy, but the only two reported cases of it transmitting to people was in Texas when some people ate some undercooked armadillo. Ir some cultures, armadillo is considered a delicacy

The main issue with armadillos is the damage that they cause while foraging or digging burrows. They can tear up a yard looking for grubs. Typically, the holes that they dig are a couple of inches deep so they can stick their

Armadillos are not protected Georgia wildlife regulations. This means that they may be trapped or hunted year-round with no limit Shooting them is a practical way to get rid of them. Trapping and removal can be effective too. If you are going to trap them, a live trap that

Paris...continued from Page 4A of snow also gives you a little better traction with your vehicle; you can drive on it easier. A wet snow usually melts upon contact with the roads surface. In this particular case, the wet snow makes for easier and more efficient road clearing – as long as dropping temperatures don't create additional hazards in the form of ice. When it does, it is very dangerous. Please stay off these roads if at all possible.

Q. Are most of our snowstorms wet snow?

A. Temperatures are the driving factor behind the types of snow we get in north Georgia. Historically for many years, we rarely had dry snow. However, the past few years most of our snow has been dry because it has been colder snow with colder temperatures.

Q. We often have to drive in the snow. What types of things should we consider when running errands in the Wintertime?

A. Please do not drive in snow unless it is absolutely necessary

B. If you have to drive in snow, (1) Make certain your tires are properly inflated and have plenty of tread. (2) Keep at least half a tank of fuel in your vehicle at all times. (3) Never warm up a vehicle in an enclosed area, such as a garage, and (4) Do not use cruise control when driving on any slippery surface, such as on ice and snow

These are just a few things that come to mind when planning to drive in a wintery
