Blairsville woman killed in two-vehicle collision on US 129N

A 76-year-old Blairsville woman has died following a two-vehicle crash that occurred on Murphy Highway just north of Nottely Marina on Friday, May 12, according to the Georgia State Patrol.

Barbara Ann Hogan was transported by air ambulance to Northeast Georgia Medical Center last Friday, where she succumbed to her injuries sustained in the crash, according to GSP.

The accident happened around 10:30 a.m. on Friday. Leading up to the crash, Stephen Anthony Watson, 32, of Blairsville, was driving his green Chevrolet Silverado in

the northbound lane of Murphy Highway, according to GSP.

As Watson's vehicle heading up the northbound lane, it crossed over the centerline and into the southbound lane, where it hit Hogan's white Ford Ranger head on, according to Watson stated to

a witness that he had been working the night before, and that he had fallen asleep behind the wheel, causing him to cross the centerline, according to Watson was conscious

the accident, and was also transported to Northeast Georgia Medical Center, according to GSP. As of press time Monday, charges were pending against
