

## **Soccer: Lady Panthers throttle** Greene County in Region opener

Greensboro - The defending Region 8-AA Champions began the defense of its crown with a 10-0 rout of Greene County.

Following an Elite-8 run to close out the 2015 season, the Union County Lady Panthers (2-0, 1-0) picked up where they left off with 6 goals in the first half.

Union would end the game early, via mercy stoppage with a goal by the team's leading scorer, freshman Madison Yost - less than 18 minutes into the second half. The 10th and final goal came off an assist from Kaitlyn Gallagher.

"Greene was not a strong team but our girls did a great job of passing and playing at our level," Union County Head Coach Tim Hunter said. "We scored early and never took our foot off the gas. The entire midfield played fantastic and our defense and keeper kept the shutout intact. Baenninger did a fantastic job of setting up other players to score.'

The Lady Panthers' scoring onslaught began in the 4th minute with a goal from senior Rachel Vester off an assist from sophomore Layne Baenninger. Sophomore Brenna In-

The Panthers opened Region 8-AA action with a win over Washington Wilkes but couldn't outslug the Tigers in the second game of the doubleheader at home on Friday evening.

Union took game one behind the right arm of senior Joseph Mancuso, who fanned 12 hitters in six innings after allowing a run in the top half of the first. The Panther bats responded with four runs in the bottom of the first, then tacked on two more in the fifth in a 6-1 victory.

Wilkes got an early lead in the first game thanks to a one-out walk and a hit batter via Mancuso in the first inning. The Tigers followed with a pair of infield singles that spotted Wilkes a 1-0 advantage.

In Union's half of the first, senior Lance Rich and Mancuso singled with one out and sophomore RJ Banton brought them both around with a double to left.

Junior Dawson Groves was hit by a pitch, senior Andrew Brown reached on a fielder's choice, and sophomore Crawford Colwell was hit by a pitch before sophomore Candler Colwell scored Banton and Brown with a base hit to

In the bottom of the fifth, Crawford Colwell knocked in two with a single after Banton and Groves were hit by a pitch and Brown laid down a sacrifice bunt.

Leading 6-1, Head Coach Robby Roxbury turned to the lefty, sophomore Cole Davis in the seventh, and after opening the inning with seven straight balls, the sophomore fired three consecutive strikes for the first out. Banton, the first baseman, recorded the second out on a running, over the shoulder catch along the fence. A base hit and a walk loaded the bases but Davis got the third out on a swinging strike three.
