They've built a new high school made up of 153,000 square feet, including a new gymnasium. The facility includes a new vocational facility, greenhouse, a sports complex, stadium renovations, and grading for future facilities.

They've also built a new middle school, made up of 100,754 square feet of space that includes a gymnasium, band room, weight room and computer laboratories.

Union and Towns counties were trapped in the dark ages for almost two hours last week as a major communications failure left both counties without cable, phone service, Internet and cell phone ser-

The massive communications outage occurred at approximately 6:30 p.m. on All land telephone lines
