## Mancuso, Panthers get back on track with 12-4 win over Riverside

Greene County forfeits doubleheader, Union credited with a pair of 7-0 victories

Union County baseball (9-3, 5-2) enters spring break riding a three-game win streak in Region 8-AA after a 12-4 win over Riverside Military Academy and two forfeit wins at Greene

In the Greene County wins, the Panthers were awarded two 7-0 shutout victories. With the Region's second tiebreaker based on fewest runs allowed in the Region, Union benefits a little bit extra from blanking the Tigers, since tiebreaker No. 2 could come into play due to the Panthers splitting with Oglethorpe County. Currently, Union and Oglethorpe are equal when it comes to the first tiebreaker - head-to-head scores, as each own a three-run victory over the other.

The Panthers will be looking to force a split with Rabun County next week, however, Union must defeat the Wildcats by five-or-more runs to swipe the tiebreaker away from Rabun.


In the Panthers' only live action last week, junior Joseph Mancuso cranked two homers and fanned six hitters in five innings during the 12-4 win over Riverside. The victory saw Union score in each of its six innings at

Senior Jackson Burks entered in the sixth and nailed down the W - working two perfect innings and striking out two.


Union got on the board in the bottom half of the first inning after junior Josh Daniel led off the game by lacing an opposite field single. Senior Hunter Hughes followed with a bunt single. Both runners would advance on a passed ball allowing senior Jake Sisum to score Daniel on a sacrifice fly to left field.

Mancuso sat down the Eagles in order for the second time and the Panthers put up five runs in their half of inning No. 2.

Junior Andrew Brown smacked a one-out single to center and freshman Candler Colwell reached on an error. With two outs, Daniel ripped a 2-run base hit to left. Hughes followed with another single to center, setting the table for Mancuso, who crushed a three-run homer

end things, via the run-rule, Mancuso surrendered four runs - three earned - in the top of the fifth.


