states to serve as president, so they nominated me," Rogers said.

NOCAD's mission is to generate revenue and provide active support to the member states for the benefit of their high schools' multi-faceted student-related activities and athletic programs.

Currently 40 states from Connecticut to Hawaii are involved with NOCAD.

Rogers' term began with

his election in January and will last until next January's national meeting, which is made up of the Executive Directors of all the member states.

"Every January we hold our national board meeting of all the member states in America, and I'll conduct that meeting," said Rogers, when asked what his job as president entailed. "I will also work with the Executive Director (Phil Weaver of North Carolina) on issues such as insurance and sponsorships."

Rogers becomes just the second coach from Georgia, alongside Ray Broadway, to be selected as President of NOCAD. The GACA, which dates back to 1938, is the oldest coaches association in the nation. In the 78 years the GACA has been in existence, Rogers is only the fifth Executive Director. He was selected as Vice President of the NOCAD at the 2015 national meeting in Annapolis, Maryland. "The Executive Board of the NOCAD meets and they decide who they are going to nominate as president, they nominated me, and I was elected by a unanimous

vote." Rogers served as Union County High School Athletic Director and its Head Football Coach until his retirement in

1994. He took over the head coaching position in 1980 and won a team-record 54 games – a total that wasn't broken until one of his very own former I players named Brian Allison s passed him in 2012.

Rogers' teams won nine games in 1983 and eight games in 1984 and 1985. He also coached boys and girls basketball at UCHS. In 1997-98 he led the Union County boys basketball team to a 24-2 record and an 8-A North Sub-Region Championship - in a season that saw the Panthers win 20 straight games.

In 1965 as a player at UCHS, Rogers was named by the *Atlanta Journal Constitution* as an All State Honorable Mention selection.
