
Panther swimmer Tanner Gay picks Lenoir-Rhyne | James Rowe state-bound

Gay, who was joined by his parents, coaches, and teammates, put his name on a Letter

of Intent to become a Lenoir-Rhyne Bear in Hickory, NC.




