back as 2012. Thankfully, we have a steady group of rental property owners that have been collecting and remitting their tax every month since the ordinance was first adopted. All rental property owners benefit from the promotion of tourism and of Union County, so everyone should be collecting and remitting the tax.

Q. Since this company has been under contract has the county collected any back Hotel/Motel taxes?

A. The company is currently going through the process of contacting all rental owners. With about a third of them being contacted, we have already collected more than \$15,000 in taxes due with more to come.

Q. I pay my hotel/motel tax every month and this collection company has con-

tacted me. Why?

A. A large majority of rental cabins are posted on the VRBO website, which is Vacation Rentals By Owner. Individual property owners and property management companies both use this site to rent their properties. So it is possible that even though you pay this tax, because it is with a rental company, you could possibly be contacted twice. Please do not get upset. So long as you have been paying the taxes that are due, you will have no problem.

Hotel/motel lodging business license tax is the only type of business license the county has, and most of the proceeds go to the Chamber of Commerce and other advertising avenues, which should only serve to increase lodging rentals for these license holders.

Our local farmers no longer have to make the drive to the Atlanta Farmers Market to sell the fruits of their labors. The time spent driving to Atlanta, the cost of the fuel and the time spent away from their families has virtually been eliminated.

Now, farmers rent a booth at the Market, back their trucks up, and sell, sell, sell. And they are selling.

Last year alone, the Market meant more than \$700,000 to the local economy. In the continuing trend of hard economic times, locals are more

than willing to drive to the local Market and purchase fresh vegetables. Folks also are getting a pretty good bargain on the craft side.

ries, but not sweet and juicy, even when I use to go pick my own, ripe on the vine. Since moving to Union County, I've headed to North Carolina to get my berries. No one here was producing enough to sell to the public. But that has changed since Dick Mills and his family opened 7M Farms out on Crump Creek Road.

Taking a ride out to the Track Rock area of this county and visiting 7M Farms is a treat for all generations. U-pick 'em Strawberries, for those of you that have done it before, know that it can be a little tough on our aging backs. Dick recognizes that, too, maybe because his 93-year-old grandmother can be seen daily on the farm and out selling at the 7M booth weekly at the Union County Farmers Market.

For this reason, the Mill Family has introduced the Vertigro Hydroponic System that people have seen at Disney World for the "older" generation to pick berries so they don't have to do all the bending. Of course, you can already buy them picked, in case you like your manicure to stay the color it was intended.

Dick has been farming with his family since he was a youngster. He did a significant stint in the corporate world but came back to farming and now there are four generations working the 7M Farm here in Union County. When Dick talks about the changes he's seen over the years in farming he chuckles at the thought of watching his grandparents go from milking by hand daily to a 6 stall parlor, then from plowing with mules to using GPS tractors.

Most of us, even avid gardeners, can't imagine the number of hours the farmer puts in each day, at least six days a week. Dick says his day starts at 4:30 a.m. and ends about 10 p.m. That's not just his day - that's his workday. That's because this year 7M will have 75 acres of row crops and their plan is to go to 230 acres as early as 2016. And they have a greenhouse operation that will soon be a 10-acre project. They grow all your favorites and them some.
