Panthers season comes to a close at Thomasville | Lady Panthers golf

Thomasville - Following a 7-hour bus ride to Thomas County in southwest Georgia, the Panthers soccer team fell 3-1 to the 2nd ranked Thomasville Bulldogs.

Sophomore Sam Seiler scored Union's lone goal unassisted, midway through the first half to give the Panthers the lead.

"It was a 100 percent hustle play and he played like he really wanted to win the game," Union County Head Coach Tim Hunter said. "We played really well and really hard. I felt like our offense was a little bit better than their defense and Sam (Seiler) and (Brett) Dietz had been giving their defense fits up front.

In the final minutes of the first half, with momentum on their side, the Panthers were looking to take a lead into the break but a defensive miscue allowed the Bulldogs to tie things up 1-1 at the half.

Thomasville would take a 2-1 lead near the midway point of the second half on a free kick following a foul.

Neither team was able to find an advantage and trailing by a goal in the final minutes,

Coach Hunter threw everything at Thomasville, and as a result, gave up a late goal. "I'm not losing 2-1," Coach Hunter said. "I sent everybody forward and they would up counterattacking for


one more goal." Following the game, Coach Hunter was singing the praises of his junior keeper Justin Eigel.

"When you talk about someone playing great, Justin Eigel at Thomasville was clearly the best goalkeeper on the field," Coach Hunter said. "Not taking anything away from the other team's players, but he was clearly the best keeper on the field.'

The Panthers finish the season with a 9-2 mark with its two losses coming to the No. 2 (Thomasville) and No. 3 ranked (Riverside Military Academy) teams in the State.



Freshman Omar Godinez (7), sophomore Parker McCombs (16), and senior Alex Mancillas (6). Photo/Todd Forrest





Following the win over Union, Thomasville spanked Lovett 6-0 to earn a Semi Final matchup between No. 1 and No. 2 when the Bulldogs travel to Norcross to face top ranked Greater Atlanta Christian.

Thomasville is the last public school to win a Class AA State Championship (2010) before the Gwinnett County private schools took over.

As for Union's future and its hopes of returning to the State and contending for a region crown, Coach Hunter believes his squad will be in the mix for the 8-AA Championship once again, despite the loss of eight seniors.

"We're returning 14 guys who played significant varsity minutes," Coach Hunter said. We are losing some important seniors but we've still got a

bunch of guys coming back who have played and have experience. It's always hard when you lose a good group of kids but I think we'll be able to weather that storm and come back strong next year.'


