growth than any other element. Plants use nitrogen to make amino acids which are the building blocks of protein. Nitrogen is also used in forming protoplasm which is the seat of cell division and plant growth. Nitrogen will stimulate plant growth. However, too much nitrogen will stimulate excessive vegetative growth. If you have ever had tomato plants that grew tall, but, would not set fruit it was probably due to excessive nitrogen.

Another element essential for plants is phosphorus. No other nutrient can be sub-

sponsible for increasing plant stituted for phosphorus. It plays a key role in photosynthesis, cell division, and energy storage. Phosphorus will promote healthy root development and fruit quality. Excessive phosphorus doesn't hurt plants. However, it can get washed into streams and cause algae blooms in lakes.

Potassium is another vital plant nutrient for plant growth. Plants use potassium in photosynthesis and respiration. Inadequate potassium causes reduced photosynthesis and increased respiration in the plant. Reduced photosynthesis and increased respiration decreases the amount of sugars produced by the plant. Therefore, inadequate potassium results in a lower quality of the fruit or the vegetable being produced. Also, an inadequate supply of potassium will result in decreased winter hardiness of plants.

How can you supply these nutrients to your plants? You can buy dry fertilizer or you can purchase liquid fertilizer. A bag of fertilizer usually has three numbers on it. These numbers represent the percentages of nitrogen, phosphorus and potassium in the bag of fertilizer. For example, a bag

of 5-10-15 has 5 percent nitrogen, 10 percent phosphorus and 15 percent potassium in the bag. Even if you buy the popular liquid foliar feed fertilizers you should pay attention to these numbers. One of the more popular liquid fertilizers has a nitrogen content of 35 percent, a phosphorus content of 15 percent and potassium content of about 15 percent. Be careful when using this formulation because you could stimulate excessive growth in tomatoes resulting in no fruit set. For more information please call me at (706)




