sweet corn for sale.


"That'll be our first sweet corn for sale," he said. "We have three or four nurseries here selling plants and we've got a lot of jams and jellies for

sale. We've got peaches and water melons here for sale. We've been having strawberries, but the local strawberries are about to run out.

"We do have some im-

ported watermelons and cantaloupes," he said. "There are about five or six crops that we allow to be brought in because they don't grow here, or they're not in season yet.

"It got busy at 8:30 and stayed busy until about noon," Cummings said. "When our sweet corn and tomatoes come in, we'll be covered up."
