P.S. Now that July 4th is here, how about a nice refreshing flavor using watermelon as the main ingredient. A recipe from Better Homes and Gardens: 3 cups seeded water melon, 3/4 cup sugar, ½ cup lightly packed fresh mint leaves, 2 cups white grape juice, I teaspoon finely grated lime peel, ¾ cup fresh lime juice, 32 ounces of club soda. Place watermelon in a blender and blend until smooth. Strain watermelon puree through a fine mesh sieve and discard the pulp.

In a large bowl, combine sugar and mint. Using a large wooden bowl, lightly crush mint by pressing it against the bowl. Add grape juice, lime peel, lime juice and watermelon puree, stirring until sugar is dissolved. Stir in Club Soda, serve over ice. Garnish with a watermelon wedge or mint sprig. Since 1915, Georgia has been plagued by negative reputation presented by the KKK. Most people see this organization as only being anti-Black. Their hatred and connections go deeper. KKK's Website claims "It is time for Clandestine Armed resistance" against those who do not align with their cause. Google lists KKK with "hate groups" that malign entire classes of people.

In 1924, U.S. Congress partnered with KKK raising funds for Confederate Memorial carving at Stone Mountain by issuance of a 50 cent coin picturing Robert E. Lee and Stonewall Jackson. All proceeds matched monies raised by the KKK.

In 1941, KKK held its national convention in Atlanta; members destroyed many Black-owned businesses.

In 1958, they claimed responsibility for bombing the Reform Jewish Temple in Atlanta and in 1987 disrupted the Martin Luther King, Jr. Day Parade in Forsyth County. They admit their creed is "disturbance and hate."

I researched volumes of Georgia KKK history online and discovered they are anti-black, anti-Catholic, anti-Republican, and anti-Semitic; they boast responsibility for numerous lynchings, murders, cross burnings, arson, and voter intimidation. They call themselves "Christian" but their practices are not in keeping with the teaching of Jesus Christ.

I believe in "freedom of speech" but that doesn't give anyone right to abuse this privilege as a weapon. It's with deep conviction that I reject the idea of promoting the KKK organization as affiliate with our peaceful North Georgia mountains. Posting their name on our roads would insult those who travel and live in our community.

On Dec. 31, 2011, after only three years of the Obama administration, the national debt had grown to a staggering increase of 41 percent.

As of this writing the debt is continuing to grow at the astounding rate of \$3.95 billion per day.
