

Lady Panthers softball: seven starters return to make the jump to AAA

When the regular season opens in a little more than two weeks for the Union County Lady Panthers softball team, Head Coach Jessica Stewart will field one of the most experienced squads during her 11 seasons at the helm. Two seniors graduated

from last year's group leaving seven starters to return off a 25win team that reached the Class AA Elite 8 in Columbus for the first time in five years.

Although if Union returns to Columbus this fall, it will be in Class AAA as members of Region 7-AAA.

Following 16 years as members of Region 8-AA, Union County makes the jump to Class AAA and softball will be the first Union County sport to get a taste of competition at the AAA level when they open the Region schedule on Aug. 9th with Lumpkin County in

Luckily, Coach Stewart and Union County will be led by three seniors who have been around the block a few times and have plenty of postseason experience - dating back to their freshman seasons.

The most experienced of the three is pitcher Laken Chambers, who has served as the ace of the Lady Panthers pitching staff since she arrived on campus as a freshman back in 2013.

record books with 366 innings pitched and 54 wins in her career strikeouts, 70 shy of

passing April Harper and moving into second place.

Angie Hughes is currently in first place, and outof-reach, in all three categories with 79 wins, 1,082 strikeouts, and 689 innings. Although, Chambers could make a run at the wins record if the Lady Panthers advance deep into the State Tournament. She won 23 games in 2014 and would tie the record with 25 wins in

Last year Chambers won 18 games while striking out 145 batters and compiling an ERA of 1.33 in 158 innings.

Offensively, Chambers is prepared to leave her mark on the record books, as well.

The four-year starter is currently fourth with 12 career homers - just three away from matching Whitney Kelley's program-best 15 dingers.

However, the first record Chambers should break will be the RBIs mark, currently held by Callie Dyer with 106. Entering 2016, Chambers is tied for second (Kelley) with 98 RBIs. Chambers already holds


the top two single season marks for RBIs with 38 in 2015 and

in hits with 115 and tied for fifth with 27 doubles, although first place is unlikely attain-She does have a shot to

reach second place in hits if she can accumulate 41 hits in fourth while finishing the year 2016. She finished with 44 hits with 13 RBIs, 11 stolen bases in 2015.

Kaitlyn Seabolt is first second in the Lady Panthers with 177 hits and Dyer is second with 155.

Chambers can also move career. She is third with 385 into third place on the career doubles list if she can match

Dyer is first with 46, Hannah Hughes is second at 44, Seabolt and Tori Dyer are tied for third with 35 doubles.

Last season, Chambers led team in batting average (.444), homeruns (5), RBIs (38), doubles (9), on base percentage (.500), slugging percentage (.707), and OPS (1.207). Meanwhile, her ratio of one strikeout per every 12.4 plate appearances was best on the team.

One Union County senior has already etched her place atop the record books and that is shortstop Kendra Tanner, who owns the career and single-season triples record.

Tanner's 15 career triples is six more than the next closest Lady Panther and her 8 triples in 2015 broke her own singleseason record from 2014.

Last season she was fourth on team with a .340 batting average and a .426 on base percentage while leading all Lady Panthers in runs (33) and triples (8). Her five doubles, 15 walks, .538 slugging percentage, and nine stolen bases were all in the team's top three.

Another three-year start-Chambers is also seventh er for Coach Stewart is infielder / catcher Lydia Arrowood.

> In 2015 she was third on the team with a .356 batting average and fifth with 21 runs and a .406 on base percentage. Her eight walks were tied for and three doubles.

In 2015, Lawn was second on team with 31 RBIs, tied for second with 2 homers, fifth with a .330 batting average, .457 slugging percentage, 7 walks, and 6 doubles. She was second best on the team with one strikeout per every 8 plate appearances.

From the circle she won six games, fanned 26 and posted a 3.80 ERA - second best on the team among pitchers with more than 20 innings pitched.

Sophomore outfielder Aladriel Arnold started the entire season as a freshman for Coach Stewart and finished with solid numbers across the

Arnold hit .247 with 5 doubles, 16 RBIs, 8 walks, 18 runs, and 4 stolen bases despite being just one year removed from middle school.

In August of last season she went 3-for-3 in a win against Class AAAAAA's Habersham Central. Arnold also had 2-hit games vs Dawson County, Johns Creek, Washington-Wilkes, and Milton.

Junior outfielder Braden Poteete was second on the team with 12 stolen bases in 12 attempts and third with 23 runs scored last season. Poteete also tallied three multi-hit games.

Sophomores Ellie Garrison and Courtney Moose both saw action in the outfield in 2015 combining for 12 RBIs, six extra base hits, and In 2015 Moose was the

starting catcher on the junior varsity squad while Garrison was successful on all nine of her stolen base attempts as a freshman

Sophomore Maddie Sutton was used primarily as a base runner in 2015 where she led the team with 14 steals on 14 attempts. She was also fourth on the team with 22 runs

Other members of the 2016 Lady Panthers that saw action last season are junior Megan Lockaby (5 hits and 2 RBIs in 2015), sophomore **Skylar Ludlum** (4 hits and 3 RBIs in 2015), and sophomore **Madeline Tanner** (11 innings pitched with 9 strikeouts in

Rounding out the sophomore class on this year's roster are: Bailey Rayfield and Brittany Spivey.

Representing the freshman class is Kallie Brown, Kristen Poteete, Mary Wischmeyer, Miranda Lockaby, and Megan Bright. The Lady Panthers will
