Lady Panthers use 20-6 outburst in fourth to down Fannin

Social Circle no match for Union as Region action resumed on Saturday

A Union County win against the rival Lady Rebels was way overdue. But on Friday they got the job done at Fannin County by a score of 55-39, in a game that was tight until the Lady Panthers outscored the home team 20-6 in the fourth quarter.

On Ŝaturday, Union's fourgame road trip continued at Social Circle where the Lady Panthers (13-5, 5-1) took care of business to remain one game back of first place Rabun County (10-7, 5-0).

Both Union squads will get Tuesday off before traveling to Greene County on Friday for the fourth consecutive away game. The Lady Panthers will con-

clude their road show when they pay a visit to Hayesville, NC on Saturday. The teams split the first two meetings after the Lady Jackets held off a furious Union rally in a heated contest that prevented the Lady Panthers from playing for their first ever Battle of the States Championship.

found another gear and less than three minutes into the fourth, the lied 22 points with nine coming in rout was officially on.

A 16-0 Union County run to open the fourth left the Blue Ridge crowd in a stunned silence as a back-and-forth affair turned into a blowout.

After knocking off the Lady Panthers in consecutive games for the first time in four years, Fannin was denied its third straight, thanks in large part to Lisa Nalaschi.

The period opened with a Nalaschi trey, then a Fannin miss turned into a Brooke Maddox lay up at the other end. Following a Lady Rebels'

timeout, Maddox fed Nalaschi, who connected on a corner trey giving Union a 43-33 advantage.


Tyler Camp and Noah Bierce didn't compete due to injuries suffered at the Area Tournament.

Adam Williams was celebrated for his four years of hard work and dedication, to go with all of the blood, sweat, and tears that he's shed for Union's upstart wrestling program.


Adam Williams is also Union's first four-year wrestler.

He plans to attend Appalachian State in Boone, NC and




Junior Chase Shook fights for position. He had 16 points at Fannin County before fouling out in the final minute. Photo/Todd Forrest




Adam Williams is the only senior wrestler on this year's squad.
