

Lady Panthers win five straight; showdown with Rabun up next

Union scores a pair of road wins; will host Rabun on Friday with top spot in 8-AA on the line

After demolishing Greene County on the road, the Lady Panthers made a statement last Saturday with a 54-41 victory at Hayesville, NC - setting the stage for a Friday night clash at Union County High School between the best of the best in Region 8-AA.

Rabun (10-8, 5-0) will host Social Circle on Tuesday while Union (15-5, 6-1) will get Tuesday off when the guys go on the road to Riverside Military Academy, but the extra day of practice wasn't enough when the Lady Panthers fell at Rabun back on Jan. 9.

The Lady Wildcats edged Union 47-41, despite trailing for the majority of the contest.

Union was able to open up a double-digit lead in the first half and maintained an advantage at 18-11 entering the second frame, 27-22 at the half and 36-34 after three.

Two starters would foul out for Union County as Rabun attempted 25 free throws to Union's four.

"We've just got to play better this time around," Union County Head Coach David Tucker said. "In the first (meeting) we were called for six offensive fouls, the free throw (differential) was unbelievable, and we still had a chance to win, but that's just part of the game.'

"Rabun is going to bring their A-game and they know that we're going to bring ours," Coach Tucker said. "We just need to keep focused, don't make excuses and be glad that we're in position to be number one.'

The third quarter saw Union extend its lead back into double-digits where it stayed for much of the second half. The Lady Jackets got within eight during the final quarter but pinpoint accuracy at the free throw line from the Lady Panthers kept the home team

at bay Union hit 17-of-22 at the charity stripe in the fourth quarter alone. They would finish 20-25 for the game.

Day hit her third trey of the game and went 2-for-2 at the line, junior Kim Coyne, and Nalaschi added a basket each to round out the third quarter scoring.

Hayesville was held to three baskets in the third and Union entered the fourth on top, 37-26.

The Lady Panthers stretched their advantage to as many as 16 points after the Lady Yellow Jackets were able to get within eight at the midway point of the fourth.

Day, who finished with a game-high 20 points, went 8-for-8 at the line in the quarter to help seal the deal. Down the stretch, Maddox hit 3-of-4 free throws, Nalaschi went 4-for-6, and Stroman was 2-of-4.

Greensboro - When the Lady Panthers made the trip to Greene County, they didn't look like the team that had been on a bus for more than 3 hours.

Union connected on 10of-21 shots from beyond the arc during the first three quarters which was more than enough to take care of an overmatched Lady Tigers squad.

Barely breaking a sweat, the Lady Panthers finished with a 2-to-1 assist-to-turnover ratio (17-to-8) and recorded 16 steals as a team.

Union outscored the Lady Tigers 19-5 in the first quarter and took a 34-8 lead into the break.

A 24-7 third quarter added insult to injury for a proud Greene County squad that is battling Washington Wilkes, Oglethorpe County, and Social Circle for one of the final two playoff spots behind Rabun and Union.

The Union County men continue to struggle since falling at Fannin County back on Jan. 16, and have since dropped their next three contests - extending their skid to four.

On Friday, the Panthers went on the road to face first place Greene County who had plenty of motivation this time around after Union embarrassed the Tigers 76-55 in Blairsville on Jan. 3.

In game two, Greene was able to keep the Panthers at bay in a 67-61 game to drop Union to 5-3 in Region play, just ahead of Washington Wilkes, who is 4-3 in 8-AA.

With Greene County's win, they move one step closer to claiming the top spot in 8-AA and hosting the Region Tournament. The No. 1 mens squad earns the right to host.

On Saturday, Union's road trip continued with another revenge game at Hayesville, NC.

The Panthers (12-9, 5-3) pulled away from the Yellow Jackets 57-45 at The Pit last month. In the rematch, Hayesville (14-5) protected their home court by pulling away in a 58-43 game.

However, Chase Shook responded with a one-handed slam of his own to keep the Panthers in it at 39-33 with 3:14 left in the period.

The Jackets scored the next five points and opened up their largest lead of the night at 44-33. But a basket by Odom and a trey from Hughes in the final 83 seconds of the third allowed Union to stay within single digits at 47-39.

Odom would do all he could to keep his team in the game with 18 points through three quarters. The Union senior would finish with 20.

Hayesville would clamp down on the Panthers and limit the visitors to four points in the fourth quarter as the Jackets maintained a double-digit lead for the final 6-plus minutes of the game.

Union and Riverside will tip at 6 p.m. on Tuesday. The Panthers defeated the Eagles 64-53 in the first meeting.

On Friday, Rabun County comes calling for a 7 p.m. tip off for the girls game with the guys to follow. The Wildcats defeated Union 78-70 at Rabun. Finally, Union and Wilkes will tip at 3 p.m. The Panthers won round one 63-46 at home.
