### Superintendent Gary Steppe to retire

After diligently serving the Union County School System for five years, Superintendent Gary Steppe will retire at the end of the 2015-2016 school year.

Steppe turned in his letter of retirement in a called meeting of the Union County Board of Education on Tuesday,

I will miss the relationships with the wonderful people I have worked with here. They are a great group of educators. His response to the board was that he planned to stay at least five years, and Steppe has been true to his word.

"That five-year period ends this spring," wrote Steppe to his staff. "It has gone by quickly for me, but has been one of the most enjoyable and



'I have worked in four wonderful school systems in two states, and with the Georgia Department of Education. 46-year career, Steppe has done everything from driving school buses to teaching classes in physical education and U.S.

He has been the superintendent of three school systems, one in his home state of North Carolina, and then two in Georgia, at Stephens County

## Remembering our veterans: six brothers serve, six return home

In honor of Veterans Day, the North Georgia News is printing this composite picture provided by Blairsville resident Vivian Martin, whose father, Homer Barnes, was one of six brothers who served in and returned safely home from World War II.

The Barnes Family lived in Union County. There were eight boys and one girl, and the girl died in early childhood when her clothing caught fire. Martin's grandmother, devastated by her loss, decided

to relocate the family to North Carolina, and they moved near Bryson Citv.

When Martin's father became an adult, he returned to Georgia to visit his childhood friend, a woman who would become his wife and Martin's mother. After the two married he remained in Union County, while his siblings continued to live in North Carolina.

Barnes was drafted at the age of 28 into the Army, and five of his brothers soon followed his induction. The oldest and youngest Barnes brothers did not serve, and all
