They went millions of dollars over budget. I have tried to call BRMEMC manager to ask about the overall cost of the new building and how it was paid for, but my calls are not returned.

The people need to be informed. Perhaps an audit should be conducted in regards to the new building.

If you look at the financial report published in the September 2013 issue of monthly GEMC magazine, page D, you can clearly see that BRMEMC earned roughly \$15 million dollars more in electric revenue in year 2012 as they did in year 2007 - with roughly the same amount of meters served. Also, their overall expenses went down slightly. Yet, they say they had to raise our rates due to loss of revenues. Their financial statements do not show this to be the case

If you (the public) feel as we do, that you are being overcharged, please call the Public Service Commission and the Georgia EMC to voice your concerns
