"May the dedication and honor of each of these men and women be remembered as a blessing from generation to generation," said Danek in closing her invocation.

"We are humbled in honoring and recognizing our community's veterans and their families - thank you for your service," said senior Dylan Byers, 18, in his opening

Byers served as the master of ceremonies for the day's event, and he next introduced seniors Cody Short, 18, and Brooks Patterson, 17, who performed "8th of November," a Country Music ballad chronicling the time of Niles Harris, a soldier in the U.S. Army, during an operation in South Vietnam on Nov. 8,

1965. "Veterans – as a representative of the students of Union County Schools, I want to thank you for your service to our country," said Danek following the moving performance from Short and Patterson. "If it wasn't for men and women of your caliber and those who stood before you, we would not be able to enjoy the freedom that we have today."

The band and chorus programs then played and sang the "Armed Forces Medley," a composition of the various service hymns of each of the five branches of the U.S. Armed Forces. As each branch's hymn began, the veterans from that branch stood and were

New to this year's ceremony was the presentation of Quilts of Valor, quilted by volunteers of the Misty Mountain Quilters' Guild, to three local veterans.

"Laurie Reid served with the U.S. Navy in the Persian Gulf during both Desert Shield and Desert Storm as a plane captain for the F-14 Tomcat fighter aircraft aboard the USS Abraham Lincoln, assigned to Fighter Squadron 124," said Danek, introducing Reid as a QoV recipient. "Medals and awards include the Southwest Asia Service Medal with Bronze Star, the National Defense Service Medal, the Good Conduct Medal and a Letter of Commendation."

Senior Justin Eigel handed quilts to fellow seniors Kat Capstick and Nathan South, who wrapped each recipient in unique quilts to call their own.

After Capstick and South enfolded Reid in her quilt, Danek moved on to recognize Shane Womack, who is the assistant principal at Union

County Middle School. Shane Womack graduated from the U.S. Naval School of Health Sciences and Field Medical Service School as a Navy Fleet Marine Force Corpsman," said Danek. "He served with the 1st Battalion, 11th Marines as a Senior Corpsman during the Persian Gulf War. After his tour in the Persian Gulf, he saw duty at several stateside duty stations. in combat with the 1st Ranger Battalion during Operation Just Cause in Panama, and during the Gulf War in Kuwait. He served with the 173rd Airborne Brigade during Operation Iraqi Freedom in Iraq, and in Operation Enduring Freedom

in Afghanistan. 'His medals and awards include the Legion of Merit, two Bronze Stars, the Purple Heart, the Soldier's Medal for Valor and six Meritorious Service Medals. He was awarded the Combat Infantryman Badge twice, and earned the Combat Master Parachutist Badge with Gold Star during a night combat parachute assault."
