Sentencing for Brown rescheduled

Sentencing for Ronnie Dale Brown on his conviction for kidnapping his estranged wife and other charges has been rescheduled for Jan. 21 at 10 a.m. at the Union County Courthouse.

Brown, 57, was scheduled to be sentenced on Thursday, Dec. 19. Brown, a Union County

native and longtime businessman, was convicted Dec. 13 of kidnapping, aggravated assault in violation of Georgia's Family Violence Act, two counts possession of a firearm during the commission


illegal weapon, and terroristic
