

## **Goble hopes to make Union Co. proud at Andrew College**

During Union County football's March 7 banquet, longtime-UCHS wide receivers coach Paul McBride revealed his "statistical Mt. Rushmore" of Panthers receivers: Blake Gowder, Jacob Rogers, Sawyer Drake and Jensen Goble.

And while a solid case could be made for the inclusion of a few other prolific pass catchers, it's tough to argue with McBride's list, particularly his final selection.

Had injuries not denied Goble five games as a sophomore, plus another 1.5 as a senior, there's a real possibility he would have rewritten the UCHS record books.

Goble, who recently signed with Andrew College (Cuthbert), still leaves with Union County's single-season reception record of 87 catches in 2022. In 2023, he came up two short with 85, despite missing most of the Banks County game and all of Union's trip to Providence Christian.

During last month's signing day ceremony at UCHS, Goble discussed what led him to sign with the first year, southwest-Georgia program.

"They were one of my first offers," he said. "It's a new program and I hope to get in there and help build it. [Andrew] has some guys that know what they're doing, and hopefully, I can get down there

Goble briefly held the school's single-game reception record, hauling in 13 passes at West Hall on Sept. 15, 2023. second at UCHS to Gowder

(225). Goble also became the first receiver since Gowder (2008-09) to record consecutive 1,000-yard seasons, while departing as the only player to amass 80-plus receptions in two separate seasons.

Goble's 181 yards vs Armuchee in September 2023 marked a career-high, despite needing only 6 catches and

50-3 rout. Later in the year, he logged 152 yards on 13 grabs in the de facto region title game at Fellowship Christian, then proceeded to torch ELCA for 11 grabs, 111 yards and a score during the postseason.

Goble was also one of the few bright spots in Union's Sweet 16 loss at Rockmart, finishing with 7 receptions for sitting out the second half of a 128 yards -- giving him six the foreseeable future.

games with 100+ receiving vards as a senior.

His senior season was capped off with a first-team All-8-AA nod from the region's coaches.

During his junior campaign of 2022 (his only injuryfree season), Goble caught 10 passes for 146 yards and 2 scores in a 21-17 win over East Jackson. One week prior, he went for 8-130-1 during a 56-49 victory vs. Providence Christian. He also hauled in 10 receptions and a score in Union's playoff victory at Model - the program's first road playoff win.

As a sophomore in 2021, his first year with the program, Goble had 4 catches at Chestatee and a season-high six vs. Murphy, NC. However, he suffered a season-ending knee injury in early October, costing him the final five games.

Goble is the son of UCHS graduates Joseph and Missy Smith Goble, and Laura Cash of Clarkesville.

"I want to thank anybody and everybody that came here [to the signing day ceremony]," he said. "My brothers, my dad, my mom, and all my family, both up here and down in Habersham, my friends, teammates and coaches. I hope I can make them all proud."

With Union County's offense taking a more conservative approach in 2024, Goble's spot on his coach's Mt. Rushmore, along with his place in the UCHS record book, appear as if they will both remain carved in stone for

## Wrestling: State bronze-medalist David Heredia chooses Emmanuel

Union County's wrestling's David Heredia, a twotime top-four State placer, signed with Franklin Springs' Emmanuel University during last month's signing day at UCHS

According to Heredia, Emmanuel's assistant coach, Gunnar Gardner, contacted the UCHS grappler via social media, and the rest is history.

"He reached out to me on Instagram and that's where it all started," he said. "[Gardner] said they were watching the state brackets and they reached out to a couple of people, but I was the first one to respond."



Heredia chose the private Christian school over Reinhardt because it reminded him of home.

"The size [of the school], the countryside, and the campus is more compacted," he said. "Plus their morals are more in line with mine."

Heredia, who wrestled at 190 lbs as a senior, hopes to remain in the 182-197-lb range at Emmanuel, where the program is losing seniors at 182 lbs and 197 lbs.

"They talked about sticking me in those [weight classes], but I told them, wherever they need me is where I'll go," he said.

Heredia departs Union County following a decorated career on the mat, including a third-place finish in Class AA in 2023. As a senior in 2024, Heredia placed fourth in Class AA, falling in the consolation finals to Model's Riley Davis.

Earlier in the winter, Heredia was a part of Union County's first Area Duals title, securing a pinfall victory

over Banks County during home floor as he scored an tion bouts to secure the bronze the finals. He went on to pick up his second-straight individual Area crown in February, defeating Banks County's Christian Holcombe via a first-round pin.

Heredia punched his ticket to the state championships by winning four of five matches at Sectionals.

As a junior, Heredia's first Area title came on his

11-5 decision over Fannin County's Colby Shaw in the 165-lb finals. A week later, he went unbeaten at sectionals, recording four straight wins, including a final-bout pinfall win vs. Shaw.

At State, Heredia cruised into the semifinals before dropping an 8-7 decision to Berrien County's Matthew Lopez. He rebounded to win two consolamedal

Heredia didn't compete during the 2022 postseason as a sophomore. At the time, Union County featured a pair of Area champions in similar weight classes: Seniors Brady Guild (160) and Sean Phillips (170). Additionally, Union had State sectional qualifiers, Huck Whisenhunt and Wilson Walker, at 182 and 195, re-

spectively.

"I want to thank [Michael] Smith-Foot and [Justin] Byers - my coaches," he said. "They are the two that got me into wrestling. I definitely want to thank my parents and Asa [Smith-Foot]. The entire Smith-Foot family is like a second family.'

In the meets ahead of State, where they collected a whopping 14 gold medals, Blairsville's Mountain Gymnastics Center (MGC) broke multiple records.

At the Tumble in the Jungle Meet in Carrollton, on March 16, Charlotte Smith (AAU Copper) scored the highest ever event score for MGC with a 9.9 on Floor Exercise.

The previous record was held by Shy'Ann Beasley with a 9.825 on beam in 2021. Charlotte scored a 9.9 on floor again at the AAU Georgia State Meet.

The next weekend, at the March Into Spring Meet in Woodstock, GA on March 24, Allie Kamber (AAU Bronze) scored MGC's highest All-Around score with a 38.25. In the very next session at the same meet, Scarlett Munn (AAU Silver) topped Allie's All-Around score with a 38.275.

The previous record was held by Emma Schuette with a 38.225 in 2023.

The season wrapped up with the girls competing at their respective state meets.

MGC's AAU athletes competed at the AAU Georgia State Meet in Roswell, GA on April 26-28. They finished their season on a high note.

MGC had nine girls win 14 State titles during the weekend. The AAU State Champions are: Maisie Henderson (AAU Copper) -- Vault State Champion with a 9.6 and All Around State Champion with a 37.7.
